



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

for the financial year ended 30 June 2024

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

Phoenix Parents' Council is a charity incorporated in Northern Ireland. The registered office of the charity is Phoenix Integrated Primary School, 80 Fountain Road, Cookstown, Co Tyrone, BT80 8QF, Northern Ireland which is also the principal place of business of the charity. 



They also comply with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2005, as updated in 2008) and with the financial reporting standards. The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the charity's financial statements.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 June 2021 have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)" and FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland", applying Section 1A of that Standard.

Income

Voluntary income or capital is included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to it, its financial value can be quantified with reasonable certainty and there is reasonable certainty of its ultimate receipt. Grants for activities are recognised as income when the related conditions for legal entitlement have been met. All other income is accounted for on an accruals basis

Expenditure

All resources expended are accounted for on an accruals basis. Charitable activities include costs of services and grants, support costs and depreciation on related assets. Costs of generating funds similarly include fundraising activities. Governance costs are those associated with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand comprises cash on deposit at banks requiring less than three months notice of withdrawal.

The trustees present their Trustees' Report and the unaudited financial statements for the financial year ended 30 June 2021.

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Charities Act (Northern Ireland) 2008, FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their financial statements in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102).

The Trustees' Report contains the information required to be provided in the Trustees' Annual Report under the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) guidelines. The trustees of the charity are also charity trustees for the purpose of charity law and under the charity's constitution are known as members of the board of trustees.

In this report the trustees of Phoenix Parents' Council present a summary of its purpose, governance, activities, achievements and finances for the financial year 30 June 2021.

The charity is a registered charity and although not obliged to comply with the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland FRS 102, the organisation has implemented its recommendations where relevant in these financial statements.

Mission, Objectives and Strategy

Mission Statement

We provide an opportunity for children of all faiths and none, from different cultural and social backgrounds to be educated together in an atmosphere where they are all equally valued. - Help to build relationships between the school and the local community and help the school to play its role in the community.
- Pursue and support social opportunities for staff and parents to meet.
- Raise funds for equipment and services to support the school and advance the education of the pupils.
- Manage the allocation of these funds appropriately.
- Engage in activities to support the school building its sustainability in the terms of prospective enrolments.

The parent's council members adopted a model constitution developed specifically for Northern Ireland by PTA-UK for Parent's councils and parent teacher associations, effect from January 2018.

Financial Review

During the year ended 30 June 2021, Phoenix Parents' Council incurred a deficit of £195 (2020 – deficit of £7,443). At the end of the financial year the charity has assets of £456 (2020 - £651) and liabilities of £0.00 (2020 - £0.00). The net assets of the charity have decreased by £(195).

It is the policy of Phoenix Parents' Council to retain a level to cover any unforeseen expenditure and allow the charity to continue in operation.

The trustees do not foresee any financial issues in the foreseeable future.


In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

Basis of independent examiner's report


