

Trustees Annual Report for 2023




During 2023 we continued our regular programme of church services and other activities. These included our weekly worship services, our Sunday School and Bibles Classes, our midweek Bible Study and Prayer meeting, our monthly youth rally, and our monthly Ladies Bible Study and our men's fellowship. We also established a new weekly meeting for primary school aged children. During the year we also enjoyed visits from various Missionary Organisations. We were able to have a Christmas dinner for members and friends of the congregation, and we had our Carol service, which once again was well attended by people from the wider community. We have continued to live-stream our Sunday services for the benefit of those who not able to attend the meetings.

The Omagh congregation has been able to provide over £38,000 for the central fund of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church for the support of its Ministers. We have also been able to give over £2,500 to various Christian Missionary organisations.

The work and witness of Omagh Evangelical Presbyterian Church is founded on the authority of the Holy Scriptures that reveal God's love for mankind in the person and work of the Lord Jesus Christ, the only Saviour of sinners, and this we believe to have been the case during 2023.
