		The PTA arrange 1 large fundraiser event each term, these include a Christmas craft fair, a school fair and an end of year BBQ and sponsored walk which allows teachers parents and students the ability to engage in a more relaxed social aspect. We also arrange other in school fundraisers which promote healthy eating and enable the children to develop their cash handling and bartering skills.

Para 1.20	<p>Main achievements of this year's fundraising has been the purchase of 5 new iPads which cost £1,845 and reading materials for the school at a cost of £1,294.</p> <p>This year we provided funding for additional covid materials which was to try and ensure that the school was protected in a small way from Covid-19.</p>

## Financial Review

Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	Para 1.21	<p>The charity has a healthy financial position as at 31<sup>st</sup> August 2021 which will be ever more essential due to the limitations placed on the fundraising activities and cancellation of planned events due to covid-19.</p> <p>The PTA has raised a significant amount of money for a school with less than 80 pupils. The low level of resources expended to raise the amount is due to the dedication of the Trustees and Members in helping and supporting the events held during the year, financially and practically.</p> <p>During the year the PTA has been able to support the School with the maintenance of it's website, reading materials, thermometers and homework folders.</p> <p>The PTA is continuing with its long-term fundraising to purchase iPads for use within the classrooms of Garryduff Primary School following the purchase of iPads for staff in 2016. This year we received a grant which allowed us to purchase some iPads which covered 80% of the cost of the equipment.</p> <p>Due to the pandemic, we have had to cancel plans for fundraising events that were in place for the start of 2021 and adapt to</p>
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		meeting via Zoom. We were able to hold some fundraising activities towards the end of the end but these were different to normal. We hope that with the lifting of restrictions next year will be closer to normal.

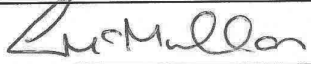
