2. Music Tuition

One of our main public benefits is to provide musical tuition for anyone who is interested in learning a traditional Ulster-Scots instruments regardless of age or ability. All our tutors are chosen based on their expertise and their track record of educating people in their specialist field.

During the year, we teach 14 people a range of Ulster-Scots musical instruments.

3. Festival Overview

We returned to a full festival in April 24 and we are delighted that it ran well and was extremely well attended. Estimates of people attending Ballymoney Spring Fair were around 7500. The 4 day festival was very successful and we are grateful to Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council for their financial support. We had additional activities which resulted in an increase in people attending, and we thank all the volunteers who helped deliver such a great event.

4. Other Projects

a) Culture, Arts and Heritage Project

A small number of people took part in the Culture, Arts and Heritage project with 12 people taking part in the project funded by CC&G Council.
