These services provided spiritual, emotional, and mental well-being benefits for participants, both in person and online.• The charity ran a weekly youth club for young people aged 12 – 18 years, providing a safe environment for them to socialise and to learn new skills. In 2025, the youth club was featured again by BBC Children in Need on its website for its successful social action project.• The charity continued to run the weekly food bank, providing free food and essential sanitary items for individuals and families on a weekly basis. Over 1,040 food packs were distributed throughout the year, as well as 50 Christmas appeal packs. Crucial to this is our partnership with local superstores like Tesco and Sainsbury, which |
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| | donate perishable foods. In addition to that, we purchased more than £2,500 worth of cupboard staple foods through our partnership with Fareshare and supermarkets. |

The previous year had seen a greater increase due to the receipt of major grant funding for our community projects. The expenditure was £191,857, representing a 0.8% increase from the previous year. |
