The trustees have had regard to the Commissions Public Benefit requirement statutory Guidance, they are satisfied the effective Safeguarding is in place of vulnerable adults and children. Safeguarding needs to takes place every 3 years with the next training cycle due to occur in 2024. All are aware of their responsibilities regarding reporting requirements.
