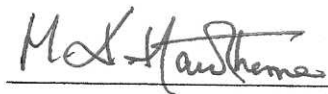

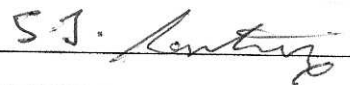

REPORT

We have just had a very good year for the club and are getting back to normal after the Lock Down, the volunteer and committee are working well together to help the elderly living in isolation and loneliness.

During the year we have organised 24 afternoon Tea Dances with 912 members this includes members from the local community. We had 2 Day Trips one to Montalto House Ballynahinch and one to Colemans Garden Centre where 98 members attended. We also had Senior Citizen Lunches and Coffee Mornings which were well attended both by the local Community and our members. The Members Overnight Respite Break this year was to The Bushtown House Hotel which the members enjoyed meeting new friends at the Dance in the hotel. 52 of our members attended.

This has been an enjoyable Year for the club, and we have met all our targets. We continue to contact the senior citizens who live alone by social media and ensure that they do not need any help and also encourage them to join the Thursday Club when it is safe to do so. We are still thankful to Newry and Mourne Community Transport for their assistance getting the senior citizens to and from our events.

This year we have completed the Volunteers Training programme and next year we hope to have a programme of training suitable to our needs this will help with the further running of the club. Can I

thank all that have been involved in running the club over the past 11 years and hope we can continue and improve our service to our members.

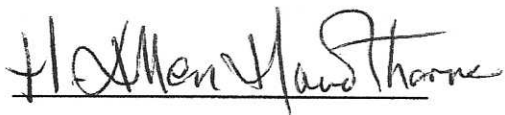

We have just had another very successful year for the club, numbers have been improving steadily and all the volunteers and committee are working well together to improve the club.

During the year we had 23 Tea Dances with an average of 38 members per a Thursday. The volunteers arrange the event and provide the refreshments, over the 23 weeks we have had several artists providing the entertainment and several speakers.

The clubs annual overnight respite break was to, Londonderry/North Coast where 51 members attended, some for the first time, our first stop was at the Silver Birch Hotel, Omagh for Morning Coffee and then to Londonderry for an Historical Tour, our overnight Break was at the White Horse Hotel there we had an excellent meal, followed by an evening of entertainment. The next day on our way home we stopped in Cookstown for an evening meal. Thanks must go to our secretary and his volunteers for all the arrangements.

Our day trip was to Ballynahinch when 53 members attended provided an excellent networking event and, on our way, home stopped at The Hillside Restaurant, Hillsborough for an evening meal. Another very enjoyable trip.

When there was no Social Dancing the volunteers kept in contact with the senior citizens by phone, especially the members living in isolation and to help to combat loneliness. This was very much appreciated by the members.

This has been a very busy and successful year for the club, and we have met all our targets. We continue to visit senior citizens in the area who live alone and encourage them to join the Thursday Club. We are still thankful to Newry and Mourne Community Transport for their assistance getting the senior citizens to and from our events.

This year we have completed our Training programme and an independent Evaluation this will help with future Funding and further running of the club. Can I thank all that has been involved in running the club over the past 7 years and hope we can continue and improve our service to our members.
