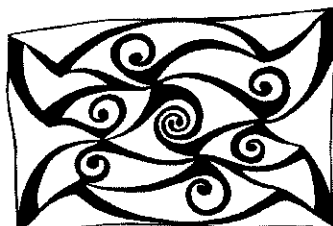

Main Activities

The objectives of the Ulster Place-Name Society are stated in the constitution:

- a) to promote the study of, appreciation of, knowledge of and awareness of place-names in the area of benefit and to publish a series of publications devoted to the field of name studies, including a journal and a bi-annual newsletter.
- b) to carry out research into place-names, promote and support the work of a survey of place-names in the area of benefit and to make the results of the survey available via a series of published volumes and via the internet where appropriate.

Publications

The society published two newsletters during the 2018-2019 financial year and these were distributed to Society members and interested parties (mostly university libraries) and were uploaded onto the Society website.

The Society published Volume XIV of *Ainm* in November 2018. It contains articles on the following subjects: the place-name element *Seimdille* (by Fiachra MacGabhann); the place-name *Ardach* (by Pádraig Ó Cearbhaill); the place-name *Mag nDumái* in Armagh (by Mícheál Ó Máinnín); and Conchubhar Ó Crualaíoch's identification of an inaugural site of the Uí Chinnsalaigh kingdom in Wexford. Reviews of the following publications were published: Vol 1 of Fiachra MacGabhann's 10-volume work on the place-names of Mayo; *An Illustrated Guide to the Place-names of Ulster*; the two-volume *Townland Names of County Wexford*; *The Placenames of Flintshire*; and *Beatha Ailbhe: The Life of Saint Ailbhe of Cashel and Emly*.

Kay Muhr and Liam Ó hAisibéil continued with their work on the forthcoming Oxford University Press publication on the family names of Ireland.

Activities

The *Your Place and Mine* project, which ran from January to March 2019, was initiated by the Causeway Coast and Glens Council as part of their good relations outreach programme. This involved Pat McKay, Kay Muhr and Gordon McCoy giving presentations on place-names, maps, folklore and material from the *Ordnance Survey Memoirs* in Cushendun, Ballycastle and Rathlin. Locals corrected or verified their pronunciations of local place-names and contributed a great deal of information.

An innovative part of the project involved encouraging locals to carry out on-line research during the sessions. This approach was used by Gordon in subsequent good relations work in Banbridge High School and St Patrick's Academy.

Pat McKay continued to provide Irish-language versions of road names and townland names for Mid-Ulster Council. He also supplied Irish-language versions of the names of the townlands of the parish of Dromore in Co. Tyrone for a local signage project.

Gordon received a contract from Belfast City Council to create a *Gaelic Map of Belfast*. This will map the townlands of Belfast, other Irish place-names in the council area, and sites of

interest concerning the Irish language. Pat McKay is the place-names consultant for this project.

Gordon is also the planner and tour guide for the *Gaelic Bus Tour of East Belfast* for Turas, the Irish-language branch of East Belfast Mission. This tour explores all aspects of Gaelic heritage in the area, with a particular emphasis on place-names as they are familiar to locals.

The Society organised two public lectures in Queen's University Belfast. Dr Kevin Murray, of University College Cork, gave a presentation on *Dinnshenchas as an Onomastic Resource* on the 29th of November 2018. Murray is doubtful of the usefulness of the *dinnseanchas* (a corpus of literature recounting the origins of place-names and traditions) in terms of place-names research. He finds the greatest contribution of this material to be in terms of mythology. On the 23rd of May 2019 Richard Warner gave a presentation on the description of Irish places and peoples by Claudius Ptolemy (c 150 AD). Warner's geographical and archaeological interpretations of the material differed from the previous analysis of linguists.

Public Benefit

Members of the Society also made presentations, as listed below. In particular, many of these illustrate the public benefit aspect of the Society's work, as stated in the constitution:

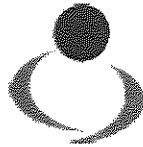
The UPNS has a close relationship with the Northern Ireland Place-Name Project (NIPNP), the professional body established in Queen's University, Belfast. The director of the NIPNP, Mícheál Ó Mainnín, who is heavily involved in expanding the organisation's townland research, is also the chair of the UPNS. The website of the UPNS www.ulsterplacename.org carries the results of the NIPNP Street and Road Name Project, which provided local authorities with Irish language versions of street and road names. The chair of the UPNS is also a member of An Coiste Logainmneacha ('The Place-names Committee'), the body established by the Department of Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht to advise the minister on place-names policy.



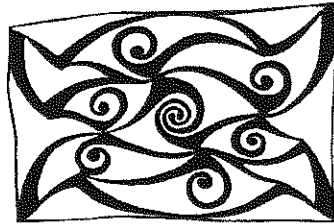

Main Activities

The objectives of the Ulster Place-Name Society are stated in the constitution:

- a) to promote the study of, appreciation of, knowledge of and awareness of place-names in the area of benefit and to publish a series of publications devoted to the field of name studies, including a journal and a bi-annual newsletter.
- b) to carry out research into place-names, promote and support the work of a survey of place-names in the area of benefit and to make the results of the survey available via a series of published volumes and via the internet where appropriate.

The society published two newsletters during the 2016-2017 financial year as well as the 13th volume of *Ainm: Journal of Name Studies*. Over 300 copies of the issue were published and most were distributed to Society members and interested parties (mostly university libraries). The UPNS did not publish anything else by itself during this period, but members were very active in contributing to important works published elsewhere:

- Kay Muhr completed her work as researcher of Irish names for the four-volume *Oxford Dictionary of the Family Names of Britain and Ireland*, which was published in November 2016. She then began working with Liam Ó hAisibéil on a publication on the family names of Ireland.
- Pat McKay began work on a jointly-authored book with Niall Comer of Ulster University on the townland names of the Barony of Coleraine. He was commissioned by Mid-Ulster District Council to supply Irish-language versions of the road names and townland names of the area.
- Gordon McCoy co-ordinated the Society's recommendations regarding the Northern dioceses to the Parish Names Project of the Church of Ireland, which aimed to provide an Irish language version of every parish in Ireland, but was hampered by a lack of input from experts on place-names. McCoy researched the secondary sources while Pat McKay and Kay Muhr provided many interpretations which were not readily available. By September 1 2017 the material on the dioceses of Connor, Armagh, and Down and Dromore was complete.

Events

The society organised two public lectures in Queen's University Belfast. Thomas Clancy of Glasgow University spoke on 'The advent of Gaelic in early Scotland: what place-names tell us?' On 17th November 2016. 'The Townland Names of County Wexford' was presented by Conchubhar Ó Cruailaoich 25th May 2017 to coincide with his publication of two volumes on the subject with his colleague Aindí Mac Giolla Chomhghaill. Both talks offered valuable insights into the nature of population movements in Britain and Ireland; Clancy's

presentation suggested a timing of the Gaelic settlement in Scotland and Ó Cruaíoch's work provided an improved model for mapping Anglo-Norman settlement in Ireland.

Main Activities

The objectives of the Ulster Place-Name Society are stated in the constitution:

- a) to promote the study of, appreciation of, knowledge of and awareness of place-names in the area of benefit and to publish a series of publications devoted to the field of name studies, including a journal and a bi-annual newsletter.
- b) to carry out research into place-names, promote and support the work of a survey of place-names in the area of benefit and to make the results of the survey available via a series of published volumes and via the internet where appropriate.

The society published two newsletters during the 2016-2017 financial year as well as the 13th volume of *Ainm: Journal of Name Studies*. Over 300 copies of the issue were published and most were distributed to Society members and interested parties (mostly university libraries). The UPNS did not publish anything else by itself during this period, but members were very active in contributing to important works published elsewhere:

- Kay Muhr completed her work as researcher of Irish names for the four-volume *Oxford Dictionary of the Family Names of Britain and Ireland*, which was published in November 2016. She then began working with Liam Ó hAisibéil on a publication on the family names of Ireland.
- Pat McKay began work on a jointly-authored book with Niall Comer of Ulster University on the townland names of the Barony of Coleraine. He was commissioned by Mid-Ulster District Council to supply Irish-language versions of the road names and townland names of the area.
- Gordon McCoy co-ordinated the Society's recommendations regarding the Northern dioceses to the Parish Names Project of the Church of Ireland, which aimed to provide an Irish language version of every parish in Ireland, but was hampered by a lack of input from experts on place-names. McCoy researched the secondary sources while Pat McKay and Kay Muhr provided many interpretations which were not readily available. By September 1 2017 the material on the dioceses of Connor, Armagh, and Down and Dromore was complete.

Events

The society organised two public lectures in Queen's University Belfast. Thomas Clancy of Glasgow University spoke on 'The advent of Gaelic in early Scotland: what can place-names tell us?' On 17th November 2016. 'The Townland Names of County Wexford' was presented by Conchubhar Ó Cruaíaoich 25th May 2017 to coincide with his publication of two volumes on the subject with his colleague Aindí Mac Giolla Chomhghaill. Both talks offered valuable insights into the nature of population movements in Britain and Ireland; Clancy's

presentation suggested a timing of the Gaelic settlement in Scotland and Ó Cruaíoch's work provided an improved model for mapping Anglo-Norman settlement in Ireland.

Public Benefit

Members of the Society also made presentations, as listed below. In particular, many of these illustrate the public benefit aspect of the Society's work, as stated in the constitution:

The organisation plays a useful role in promoting cross-community understanding by providing information on the historical influence of the various indigenous languages of Ulster in a harmonious and non-contentious manner.

Relationship with other Organisations

The society is a member of the Federation for Ulster Local Studies (FULS). This is a valuable relationship, as FULS promotes UPNS events and provides UPNS with details of events which may be of interest to our members. FULS also makes the UPNS aware of legislation and events related to charities and voluntary organisations in Northern Ireland.

The UPNS has a close relationship with the Northern Ireland Place-Name Project (NIPNP), the professional body established in Queen's University, Belfast. The director of the NIPNP, Mícheál Ó Mainnín, who is heavily involved in expanding the organisation's townland research, is also the chair of the UPNS. The website of the UPNS www.ulsterplacename.org carries the results of the NIPNP Street and Road Name Project, which provided local

authorities with Irish language versions of street and road names. The chair of the UPNS is also a member of An Coiste Logainmneacha ('The Place-names Committee'), the body established by the Department of Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht to advise the minister on place-names policy.

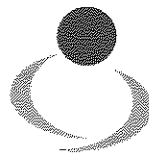
