Trustees' Annual Report for the year ended 31st December 2024

The Trustees present the annual report and Statements of Receipts and Payments and Assets and Liabilities for St Bartholomew's Church, Donaghmore Parish for the year ended 31st December 2024.

Objectives and Activities

The charitable purpose of the Church of Ireland is the advancement of religion.

The principal function of St Bartholomew Church, Donaghmore Parish is to support the advancement of the Christian religion by promoting, through the work of St Bartholomew Church, Donaghmore Parish, the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. Being open to and engaging with society as a whole and offering support for those needing help are fundamental to the practical delivery of the benefits of Christianity.

As a result of activity in the pursuit of the advancement of the Christian religion, St Bartholomew Church, Donaghmore Parish has custody of property and of records, materials and artefacts of significance to the cultural and religious heritage. Maintenance of which is undertaken by the Select Vestry of St Bartholomew Church, Donaghmore Parish.

Achievements, Performance & Public Benefit 2024 (2023 in brackets)

The Parish continued to have regular Services of Worship throughout the year 2024. This year we continued to meet every Sunday except for two Sundays when the three parishes came together over Summer to join services when the Minister – In – Charge was on holiday. There were 50 (52) Sunday Services of Worship in 2024 (2023) with an average congregation of 27 (24). The average number of Communicants each month was 16 (15). As well as 8 (7) Occasional Services, 1 (0) Baptisms and 0 (0) Marriage, there was 5 (3) burials (1 Parishioners, 4 Non – Parishioners). On Christmas Eve evening, a service was held in Donaghmore and the attendance was 26 (28).

Pastoral work continued throughout 2024 as best as possible. The priority of the Minister – In- Charge is the elderly, the sick and the bereaved. Other visiting takes place as and when time permits.

In Summer 2024, the annual Church Walk and BBQ was held at the Church with the support of all Parishioners. A very enjoyable and social evening was had with delicious food and children's games to compliment.

The Parish held a concert in September 2024, organised by Trustee, Mr Norman McKnight, with the Christian band 'Live Issue' in attendance. This was well attended with Parishioners and Non – Parishioners from across the Grouped Parish and the local community. The evening was very successful with approximately 200 tickets sold and a 'tuckshop'. All monies raised were for Church funds.

A Sunday School has been operating since Autumn 2022 and now meets every Sunday except for the monthly Family Service with a weekly attendance on average of 6 children. The Sunday School teachers have been vetted through Access NI and we have officers in place in line with the Church of Ireland Policy on Safeguarding Trust.

The parish – wide 'Steadfast' Youth Fellowship is continuing and going very well with a regular attendance and everyone is keen to see it progress in future.

In Spring and Autumn 2024, a short Bible Study series continued and was held in the Rectory. All three parishes in the Group were represented at those meetings and it was a good time spent with others seeking to further develop their faith in Jesus.

A ladies meeting for all three churches was held twice during the year organised by the Minister's wife.

Repairs and general maintenance were continued on the Church property during 2024.

The Parish has given careful consideration to the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland's guidance on public benefit to ensure that the actives entered into during the year have helped to achieve the Parish's objectives and activities, as well as providing public benefit. The Parish currently provides burial facilities for other Christian Denominations in the area.

Financial Review 2024 (2023)

The Income into the Parish from various sources was £63,750 (£60,361) with outgoings of £55,304 (£55,476) giving a surplus of £8,446 (surplus £4,885.) The surplus is from higher bank interest and fundraising events.

The Bank and Cash in Hand Balance at 31st December 2024 was £68,480 (£60,034). It is the Trustee's Policy to hold sufficient reserves to cover unexpected emergencies, to build up funds to pay for future maintenance to the Church and grounds and to further the Objectives and Activities of the Church of Ireland.

Going Concern

The trustees have reviewed the budgets for the year ahead and are satisfied that there are adequate funds in place to ensure that the Parish can continue its activities and the financial statements for the year ended 2024 can be signed off as a going concern.

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document and Constitution of the Charity

Chapter III of the Constitution of the Church of Ireland governs Parishes and Parochial Organisation. The Select Vestry members are the Charity Trustees

Recruitment and Appointment of Select Vestry (Trustees)

All members of the Church of Ireland who are over the age of 18 and are either resident within the parish or live elsewhere but have been accustomed members of the congregation for at least three months, may register as members of the General Vestry of the Parish, allowing them to attend and vote at meetings of the General Vestry and to stand for election to the Select Vestry. Meetings of the General vestry are held at least once a year. The Select Vestry is elected as part of this General Vestry meeting. The Select Vestry will hold their positions for a period of one year. Select Vestry members may be re-elected annually and there is no limit on the number of terms which may be served.

Pay and remuneration

The Revd. Rodney Magennis was appointed as Minister-In-Charge of the Grouped Parishes of Aghaderg, Donaghmore and Scarva in July 2023 and introduced at a special service in September that year where he receives a stipend, office and locomotory allowances directly from the Parishes in accordance with figures approved by the General Synod of the Church of Ireland. The Donaghmore Parish pays 10% of this sum.

The Trustee, Mr Neil McKnight's Business, Silverwood Landscapes, was engaged to maintain the Grave Yard and in 2024, the Parish paid £2,400 for carrying out this work.

The Trustee, Mrs Gretta Jackson acted as Sexton and was paid £750 for carrying out this work.

Organisational Structure

The Select Vestry is responsible for the day-to-day management of the Parish. The Select Vestry comprises a member of the Clergy serving in the Parish, the Church wardens, the Glebe wardens and generally no more than twelve other members of the General Vestry elected at the General Vestry Meeting.

The Select Vestry is chaired by the member of the Clergy officiating in the Parish. Select Vestry members are responsible for making decisions on matters of general concern and importance to the parish including deciding how Parish funds are to be applied. The Treasurer, Neil McKnight is responsible for the Current Account and the Building Funds. The Assistant Treasurer, Trevor McGaffin is responsible for the Graveyard Account and The Glebe National School Account.

The Select Vestry meets at times fixed by the members or by the Diocesan Synod. Special meetings may be convened at any time by the Chairperson or the Church wardens.

Compliance with Public Benefit

The Parish has given careful consideration to the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland's guidance on public benefit to ensure that the activities entered into during the year have helped to achieve the Parish's objectives and activities, as well as providing public benefit. Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities




