Activities

Purposes: The Association is established to promote and advance Polish culture, to promote and advance education and to provide and promote leisure, social and recreational activities and facilities for children and young people, and in particular but not exclusively those of Polish origin and descent, aged between 3 and 18 years old ("hereinafter called the beneficiaries") who are resident in the Belfast and Greater Belfast areas and their environs of Northern Ireland (hereinafter called the "area of benefit") without distinction of age, gender, disability, sexual orientation, nationality, ethnic identity, political or religious opinion, by associating the statutory authorities, community and voluntary organisations and the inhabitants in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure-time occupation, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said beneficiaries and in particular: (1) to promote and advance education in all matters relating to the Polish Language, Polish Affairs, History, Geography, Arts, Crafts and Polish Cultural Heritage together with the welfare and social interaction of the Polish community in the area of benefit; (2) to establish and maintain or co-operate with any local educational authority, statutory or voluntary body in the maintenance of a supplementary school for the provision of out of school hours educational and recreational facilities in the interests of social welfare for children and young people aged 3 to 18 (3) to foster an atmosphere of mutual support among parents of Polish children and encourage the provision of mutual support and encouragement among such parents and their children; (4) to promote the integration of the Polish Community and to encourage appreciation within the area of benefit in all matters relating to Polish arts, history, traditions, language and culture thereby promoting good race relations in an effort to foster a sentiment in favour of equality and diversity and thereby endeavour to eliminate ethnic discrimination; (5) to advance any other exclusively charitable purpose as the Board, may from time to time, decide in accordance with the law of charity.

What the charity does: The prevention or relief of poverty, The advancement of education, The advancement of citizenship or community development, The advancement of the arts, culture, heritage or science, The advancement of human rights, conflict resolution or reconciliation or the promotion of religious or racial harmony or equality and diversity, The relief of those in need by reason of youth, age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage, Other charitable purposes

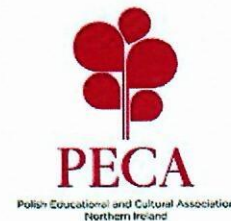

Before the end of financial year few members of the Board gave their resignation. They were: Ewa Watson, Marlena Sekula, Oliwia Garow oraz Grzegorz Bartosiewicz.

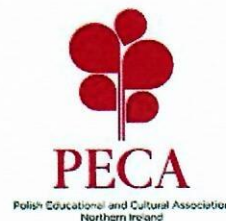
Purpose of the charity:

Financial year 1st September 2016 to 31st August 2017 was our first full financial year as a registered charity in Northern Ireland.

It was a successful year for PECA. We were involved in different projects and events which have been directly related to our aims and objectives as well as the public benefit of the organisation. Our main purpose was running Polish Saturday School as a supplementary school.

Based on the previous trustees report presented at the first part of the AGM held on 4th March 2017 PECA's/PSSB Board responsibilities and achieved goals included:

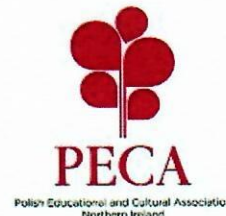
- No agreement to continue to rent premises from St.Michaels PS. Moving to new location in Euston Street PS;
- Adjusting tuition fees;
- Preparing, approving and overseeing the budget of PECA/PSS Belfast;
- **assisting in organization of the School and the Association's events;**
- Actively developing volunteering program with Volunteer Now project and gain funding from Small Volunteer Grant ;
- Purchase of equipment and materials needed for PSSB;
- Change of bank account from HSBC to Danske Bank according to recommendations by OFMDFM(now TEO);
- Registration in Education Authority as Youth Group and receiving funding for financial year 2016/2017;
- Board members as an employer took part in recruitment interviews for teachers according to our recruitment procedures;
- Advertising statutory goals of the association to promote polish language, culture and traditions – Bilingual Belfast project;
- **Taking part in 'B.Me' project together with Chinese Welfare Association;**
- co-operation with other Polish organizations and local institutions;
- **applying for grants and other funding for the School and Association's statutory activities;**
- During the course of the year, the Board members, PECA/PSS Belfast employees and volunteers took part in a numbers of training sessions,including: governance and finances, Risk Assessment, First Aid, Child Protection, Health and Safety, Open Data in a Day
- **publication and distribution of the magazine „Nasz Express”- polish magazine promoting cultural events;**
- representing the Association in contacts with statutory bodies and local organizations, support work during events (Mela festival, Polish Independence Day, Award Ceremony of the Gold Cross of Merit to Jerome Mullen- Honorary Consul of the Republic of Poland in NI, family Christmas day in Skainos).

After the change of the boards members, new trustees focus on the main project of the association which was PSSB and had to face a few challenges:

- In April, because of the termination of the lease agreement we had to change our premises of the PSSB to new location to Holy Rosary PS
- Preparing, approving and overseeing the budget of PECA/PSS Belfast
- Joining Polish Educational Forum in NI – Organisation to support all Polish Schools in NI
- Board members as an employer took part in recruitment interviews for teachers according to our recruitment procedures

- During the course of that time the Board members, PECA/PSS Belfast employees and volunteers took part in a numbers of training sessions, including: governance and finances, Risk Assessment, Child Protection, Health and Safety, preparing for the GDPR

- Talking part in Stronger Together Conference in May 2017
- Representing PECA in Racial Equality Suroup meeting
