Objectives

Key Activities in this year

Other benefits that people can gain from the opportunity that we are providing is a social aspect, meeting new people from different backgrounds as everyone comes together for the same outcome of playing music. Furthermore, it helps to provide children with a boost of confidence which can help in other aspects of their lives. The Chairty also helps build community relationships as the band performs as cross-community events.


Statement of Trustee's Responsibilities


