Covid arrived in March and it was great to see our units adapting to continue guiding through April, May and June. A very challenging time for us all.

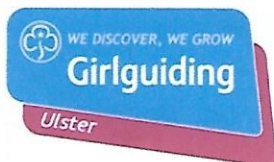
There was no harm flowing from the Charities purposes and that there was no private benefit.
