A summary of the Charity's main activities to further its purposes for the public benefit and the main achievements in the year

Throughout the year a number of units namely, Cullybackey Rainbows, Brownies & Guides, Kilbride Rainbows, Ballymoney and Broughshane Rainbows and Look Wider groups all worked towards various awards. One Guide member was selected to go on an orchestra trip and the County made a donation to help with the cost of the trip. Two Guides were also selected to go on an International trip and the County made a donation to help with that also. The County held a coffee morning for all it's members in Toast Cullybackey and it was an opportunity for members to relax and chat which was enjoyed by all. At the AGM a number of certificates and awards were handed out - 5 leadership qualifications, 7 young leaderships, 1 going away with certificate, 2 Queens Guide Awards, 4 DofE bronze and 6 DofE Silver. 2 leaders received their 20 year service award and 2 received their 10 year service award. One member received their 50 year service award. At the end of the year members of the county were invited to a wreath making morning. Unfortunately, we had a number of units close this year due to lack of volunteers or leaders. These units were Ahoghill Rainbows, Ballycastle Rainbows & Brownies and Ballymena Brownies and Guides. The balance of these accounts were transferred to the County account for holding. We also sold some county badges to Lorne for resale.
