**A summary of the Charity's main activities to further its purposes for the public benefit and the main achievements in the year**

At the beginning of the year we had 13 guides increasing to 18 by the end of December 2024. The guides enjoyed a varied programme of guiding activities gaining First Aid, Craftism and Camp Craft Interest badges and Be Well and Take Action Theme Awards. We took part in an Ulster Scots Challenge, making and sampling Soda Farls, Potato Bread and Crannachan. Everyone designed their own tartans and sewed them together to make a banner. An experienced First Responder took an evening of CPR, Defibrillator and EpiPen training, encouraging everyone to try out the different equipment available in an emergency. We hosted and took part in the annual South Belfast Captainball Competition. In April we organised our own Lorne walk through Lagan Meadows. We used half of the money raised to buy 2 new tents the remainder was donated to Lorne. In June, 13 guides and 2 leaders attended the weekend Buzz Camp. As part of our Christmas Good turn we made and sold Christmas cards and Gift Tags raising £150 for "Baby Basics" Belfast.
