A summary of the Charity's main activities to further its purposes for the public benefit and the main achievements in the year

We began the year welcoming 6 Rainbows to our unit which meant on average we had 13 girls attending weekly. We had a very active year for badgework, with the new girls working together to achieve their promise badges. All girls also enjoyed completing the 'Girlguiding Ulster Goes Wild' badge and 'Performer' badge and the older girls also gained the 'Inventing' badge. In December the girls really enjoyed an outing to Lorne to a 'Christmas adventure with the melting snowman' and especially the highlight of the evening which was a visit to Santa and Mrs Claus. They also completed a range of crafts, including bracelets, making Christmas tree decorations, painting glass tea light lanterns for Mother's Day and decorating Easter bonnets. We held our Annual Thinking Day Service with the Rainbows and Guides in the church, after which the Brownies hosted the congregation by serving shortbread and washing dishes. When the brighter nights arrived the Brownies enjoyed adventures outside completing an Easter Egg Hunt, scavenger hunt challenge and spring animals treasure hunt. The girls also enjoyed a 'Teddy Bears Picnic' theme night before the October half term break and then we finished the year with a Jungle Themed Party which was the final clause of the 'Girlguiding Ulster Goes Wild' badge. The girls also had the opportunity to spend the 'tokens' they earned throughout the year in our own 'Brownie shop'.

We began the year with 12 girls following a successful recruitment drive. In September our girls enthusiastically joined with Rainbows, Brownies, Guides and Rangers across Northern Ireland to take part in Girl Guiding Ulster's centenary celebrations. As part of this programme of events girls explored the history of Girl Guiding in Ulster by making crafts and playing games loved by Brownies in the past. They also looked to the future of Guiding in Ulster by designing their own ideas for a new Brownie uniform. The girls celebrated Girl Guiding with a centenary party, at which they received the badge they had earned. We had a very active year for badgework, with all girls working together to achieve their promise badges and completing the 'Performing' interest badge. They also completed a range of crafts, including sewing their own 'Christmas creatures' and felt Easter eggs, and enjoyed Girl Guiding's Unit Meeting Activity games, with 'Crazy Comets' proving to be a lasting favourite. We held our Thinking Day Service with the Rainbows, Guides and Rangers in the church, after which the Brownies hosted the congregation by serving shortbread and washing dishes. In April, the Brownies enjoyed adventures outside in the sunny weather, completing a scavenger hunt challenge. In May, the girls celebrated the coronation of King Charles with coronation crafts and games. The girls also had the opportunity to spend the 'tokens' they earned throughout the year in our own 'Brownie shop'. We finished the year with a beach themed party.

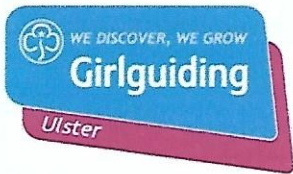
A summary of the Charity's main activities to further its purposes for the public benefit and the main achievements in the year

We began the year with 9 girls and grew to 14 during the year through recruitment. In September our girls enthusiastically joined with Rainbows, Brownies, Guides and Rangers across the UK to take part in Girl Guiding's Future Girl initiative to tackle plastic pollution. As part of this programme of events girls made a giant starfish out of their plastic waste, committed to 'plastic promises' to reuse and recycle, and wrote a letter to their local MLA expressing their concerns about plastic pollution. Girls also learnt about elections and held their own ballot as part of UK Parliament Week. We had a very active year for badgework, with all girls completing the Skills Builder 'Communicate' and the 'Performing' interest badge. New Brownies worked together to achieve their promise badges, while older girls choose to complete either 'Aviation' or 'Painting' interest badges. Girls enjoyed adventures outside of the hall when they joined with Rainbows, Guides and the Boys' Brigade to attend their own private screening of the film 'Frozen 2' and on their trip to PLAYZONE. We held our Thinking Day Service with the Rainbows, Guides and Rangers in the church, after which the Brownies hosted the congregation by serving shortbread and washing dishes. In March we moved to remote provision by sending girls weekly emails containing an activity pack with badgework and programme activities adapted to be completed at home, which ended with a VE Day tea party at home.

There was no harm flowing from the Charities purposes and that there was no private benefit.
