A summary of the Charity's main activities to further its purposes for the public benefit and the main achievements in the year

During 2024 our membership rose to 35. We worked on the GGUK Ranger Programme and the DofE Programme. Girls completed bronze, silver and gold Ranger Awards as well as bronze, silver and gold DofE Awards.

For DofE, 9 girls did bronze expeditions in North Down, 11 girls did silver expeditions in the Mourne and 4 girls did gold expeditions in Cumbria.

During the year girls learnt about health and keeping fit; playing lots of different games and sports including captain ball and yoga. We enjoyed craft, cooking, planting wildflowers and a visit to Lorne for team building activities.

There was no harm flowing from the activities and purposes of the Rangers Guide Unit and no private benefit was derived from the activities of the Ranger Guide Unit.
