A summary of the Charity's main activities to further its purposes for the public benefit and the main achievements in the year

During 2024 there were 35 Guides. We followed the GGUK Guide Programme enjoying activities in all 6 themes, many girls completed badges and bronze, silver and gold Guide awards. The programme included sessions in self-defence, yoga and a guest from Guide Dogs for the Blind.

We played games and enjoyed seasonal craft and outdoor activities all year. We visited Lorne estate in June for Crate Climbing and Zip Line sessions

We also held Guide Camp at Lorne in August. During camp, girls took part in activities including games, craft, high ropes and climbing, outdoor cooking and campfire singing.

There was no harm flowing from the activities and purposes of the Guide Unit and no private benefit was derived from the activities of the Guide Unit.
