A summary of the Charity's main activities to further its purposes for the public benefit and the main achievements in the year

The rangers organised an easter party for the rainbows, where they made easter crafts and had an egg hunt. As the evenings became warmer the rainbows were able to play outside more doing their nature UMA's having bug hunts and creating nature trails for each other.

After the summer holidays the rainbows finished off their nature and worked on their Agility interest badges. Before the Christmas break the rainbows had a trip to Lorne where they carried out a Christmas craft and got to meet Santa.
