The trustees present the annual report and statements of Receipts and Payments and Assets and Liabilities for Kilcronaghan Parish Church for the year ended 2024

Objectives and Activities

The charitable purpose of the Church of Ireland is the advancement of religion.

The principal function of Kilcronaghan Parish Church is to support the advancement of the Christian religion by promoting, through the work of Kilcronaghan Parish Church the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. Being open to and engaging with society as a whole and offering support for those needing help are fundamental to the practical delivery of the benefits of Christianity.

As a result of activity in the pursuit of the advancement of the Christian religion, Kilcronaghan Parish Church has custody of property and of records, materials and artefacts of significance to the cultural and religious heritage and maintenance of which is undertaken by the select vestry of Kilcronaghan Parish Church.

Achievements, Performance & Public Benefit

Kilcronaghan Parish Church is under the incumbency of the Reverend Rosemary Diffin. As a church we provide a weekly service of Morning Prayer, Evening Prayer and a once per month service of Holy Communion. We also provide for baptisms, weddings, funerals and pastoral support.

We began the year with the first of our Big Breakfasts. The speaker was Jim Stewart who told us his life story. In March we had a Daffodil Tea to raise funds for the rector's mission trip to Peru in June. During Lent we had a Lenten service every Wednesday and special services during Holy Week. Our dawn service at the old church on Easter Sunday was followed by a parish breakfast in the hall.

Our prayer fellowship meets on a Wednesday evening followed by a Bible study

In June a special afternoon tea party was held in the grounds of the rectory. We were entertained by Tamlaghtmore Silver Band. Bouncy castles were provided for the entertainment of the children.

The Connect group continues to meet every Thursday morning – a community coffee morning followed by a talk or activity one week and on alternate weeks a community soup lunch. An excursion took place to Galgorm Garden Centre in December.

All our other organisations continued to meet –Coffee and Yarn, BB, Little Acorns, the Bowling Club

The Sunday School excursion took place in June.

In October we had a Gospel Concert. A big breakfast was held to raise funds for Bishop Given Gaula and in November we had another breakfast for the Poppy Appeal.

Our usual Harvest and Carol services took place and some special songs of praise services when we invited local bands to accompany the hymn singing. Evening services resumed with monthly café church, songs of praise, service of the Word and a communion service.

The GFS restarted with a Big Night back and in October a Lite Party was held.

Several special services were held during the year including the Royal British Legion's Remembrance Day service.

Items of food were collected during the year and given to the local food bank.

The prayer fellowship resumed in September and this was followed by a number of different Bible courses.

The church continues to support 6 mission partners and other charities. Special collections were taken up for the Bishops' Appeal and donations were collected for Samaritans' Purse.

Other events during the year included an Ulster Scots' night, a Pudding Night with craft stalls, 2 lego building workshops and an Advent celebration.

The tractor Run in December raised money for the Air Ambulance.

Our Child Protection Policy is in accordance with the Safeguarding Trust policies of the Church of Ireland.

Financial Review

Going Concern

The trustees have reviewed the budgets for the year ahead and are satisfied that there are adequate funds in place to ensure that the Parish can continue its activities and the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024 can be signed off as a going concern.

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document and Constitution of the Charity

Chapter III of the Constitution of the Church of Ireland governs Parishes and Parochial Organisation. The Select Vestry members are the Charity Trustees

Recruitment and Appointment of Select Vestry (Trustees)

All members of the Church of Ireland who are over the age of 18 and are either resident within the parish or live elsewhere but have been accustomed members of the congregation for at least three months, may register as members of the general vestry of the parish, allowing them to attend and vote at meetings of the general vestry and to stand for election to the select vestry. Meetings of the general vestry are held at least once a year. The Select Vestry is elected as part of this General Vestry meeting. The Select Vestry will hold their positions for a period of one year. Select Vestry members may be re-elected annually and there is no limit on the number of terms which may be served.

Pay and Remuneration

The Rector is not paid directly by the Parish. A monthly assessment is paid to the Diocese which comprises Stipend, Locomotory Allowance, Employer's National Insurance and Employers Clergy Pension Contributions.

Organisational Structure

The select vestry is responsible for the day to day management of the parish. The select vestry consists of the member of the clergy serving in the parish, the churchwardens, the glebe wardens and generally not more than twelve other members of the general vestry elected at the General Vestry.

The select vestry is chaired by the incumbent or other member of the clergy officiating in the parish. Select vestry members are responsible for making decisions on matters of general concern and importance to the parish including deciding how parish funds are to be applied.

The select vestry meets at times fixed by the members or by the diocesan synod. Special meetings may be convened at any time by the chairperson or the churchwardens. In 2024 the Select Vestry met 5 times during the year and the average attendance was 72%.

Compliance with Public Benefit

The Parish has given careful consideration to the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland's guidance on public benefit to ensure that the actives entered into during the year have helped to achieve the Parish's objectives and activities, as well as providing public benefit.


Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities





Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024

1. Accounting policies

Set out below are the principal accounting policies which have been adopted in the compilation of the Receipts and Payments Account and the Statement of Assets and Liabilities

(a) Receipts and Payments Account

All items of income and expenditure included within the Receipts and Payments Account have been accounted for on a cash receipts basis.

(b) Statement of Assets and Liabilities

(i) Assets retained for the Parish's own use

The assets of the Parish, retained for its own use comprise:-

- Church Buildings and Graveyard
- Parish Hall
- Rectory
- Old Rectory
- Glebe land

The Church Building and Graveyard are deemed to be Heritage assets as defined by the Charities SORP (FRS102). These Heritage assets are not included in the statement of assets and liabilities as information on the cost or valuation is not available and such information cannot be obtained at a cost commensurate with the benefit to the users of the accounts and to the parish.

The Parish Hall is not included in the statement of assets and liabilities as information on the cost or valuation is not available and such information cannot be obtained at a cost commensurate with the benefit to the users of the accounts and to the parish.

The Rectory is valued at domestic rateable value as at 1 January 2017

The Old Rectory is valued at cost price when purchased from RCB approximately 20 years ago.

The Glebe land has been recognised at a value which the select Vestry deem to represent the estimate fair value of the property at 1 January 2017.

No depreciation has been provided on these buildings as the current estimated residual value is not less than its carrying value and the remaining useful life currently exceeds 50 years.

Subsequent expenditure on these assets is recorded at cost.

ii) Investments

Fixed asset investments comprising investment properties, investments in equities (ordinary shares) and investment in RCB/CIT Unit Trusts are initially recorded at cost and are then subsequently stated at fair value at each year end date. Investments in unquoted investments are recorded at cost and are assessed annually for impairment.

Trustees' Annual Report for the year ended 31 December 2023

The trustees present the annual report and statements of Receipts and Payments and Assets and Liabilities for Kilcronaghan Parish Church for the year ended 2023.

Objectives and Activities

The charitable purpose of the Church of Ireland is the advancement of religion.

The principal function of Kilcronaghan Parish Church is to support the advancement of the Christian religion by promoting, through the work of Kilcronaghan Parish Church the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. Being open to and engaging with society as a whole and offering support for those needing help are fundamental to the practical delivery of the benefits of Christianity.

As a result of activity in the pursuit of the advancement of the Christian religion, Kilcronaghan Parish Church has custody of property and of records, materials and artefacts of significance to the cultural and religious heritage and maintenance of which is undertaken by the select vestry of Kilcronaghan Parish Church.

Achievements, Performance & Public Benefit

Kilcronaghan Parish Church is under the incumbency of the Reverend Rosemary Diffin. As a church we provide a weekly service of Morning Prayer, Evening Prayer and a once per month service of Holy Communion. We also provide for baptisms, weddings, funerals and pastoral support.

The year began with the clearing of the parish hall in preparation for renovation work to be carried out. This began in early February and continued until September when the hall was finally opened on 30th September by the Rt. Revd. Andrew Forster, Bishop of Derry and Raphoe.

During this time our organisations met in the church, the Mc Kinney Hall or the Orange Hall

During Lent we had a Lenten service every Wednesday and special services during Holy Week. We were delighted to be able to resume our dawn service on Easter Sunday.

Our prayer fellowship meets on a Wednesday evening followed by a Bible study.

In June a special afternoon tea party was held in the grounds of the rectory to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles. We were entertained by Tamlaghtmore Silver Band. Bouncy castles were provided for the entertainment of the children.

The Connect group continues to meet every Thursday morning – a community coffee morning followed by a talk or activity one week and on alternate weeks a community soup lunch. An excursion took place to Dobbies new garden centre at Junction One.

The Sunday School excursion took place in June.

After the opening of the parish hall we had a Gospel Concert organised by Eric Drennan.

Our usual Harvest and Carol services took place and some special songs of praise services when we invited local bands to accompany the hymn singing. Evening services resumed with monthly café church, songs of praise, service of the Word and a communion service.

The GFS restarted with a Big Night back and in October a Lite Party was held.

Several special services were held during the year including one where the Revd Rosie was inaugurated as Diocesan Chaplain of the GFS and a fundraising service for the Air Ambulance by Knockloughrim Accordion Band.

Items of food were collected during the year and given to the local food bank.

The prayer fellowship resumed in September and this was followed by a number of different Bible courses.

The church continues to support 6 mission partners and other charities. Special collections were taken up for the Bishops' Appeal for Turkey/ Syria and donations were collected for Samaritans' Purse.

A number of fundraising events were held during the year for our new hall fund. These included a sponsored walk by our rector and her husband Ronnie from Coast to Coast across England and a sponsored fast by a parishioner. At the end of November a very successful Christmas Tree Festival was organised and our annual Tractor Run was held in December. The tractor run donations went to the Bishops' Appeal for the Middle East

Our Child Protection Policy is in accordance with the Safeguarding Trust policies of the Church of Ireland.

Financial Review

- The reserves of the Parish are held for the advancement of its charitable purpose, other than restricted reserves which are held for a designated purpose – see note 13

Going Concern

The trustees have reviewed the budgets for the year ahead and are satisfied that there are adequate funds in place to ensure that the Parish can continue its activities and the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2023 can be signed off as a going concern.

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document and Constitution of the Charity

Chapter III of the Constitution of the Church of Ireland governs Parishes and Parochial Organisation. The Select Vestry members are the Charity Trustees

Recruitment and Appointment of Select Vestry (Trustees)

All members of the Church of Ireland who are over the age of 18 and are either resident within the parish or live elsewhere but have been accustomed members of the congregation for at least three months, may register as members of the general vestry of the parish, allowing them to attend and vote at meetings of the general vestry and to stand for election to the select vestry. Meetings of the general vestry are held at least once a year. The Select Vestry is elected as part of this General Vestry meeting. The Select Vestry will hold their positions for a period of one year. Select Vestry members may be re-elected annually and there is no limit on the number of terms which may be served.

Pay and Remuneration

The Rector is not paid directly by the Parish. A monthly assessment is paid to the Diocese which comprises Stipend, Locomotory Allowance, Employer's National Insurance and Employers Clergy Pension Contributions.

Organisational Structure

The select vestry is responsible for the day to day management of the parish. The select vestry consists of the member of the clergy serving in the parish, the churchwardens, the glebe wardens and generally not more than twelve other members of the general vestry elected at the General Vestry.

The select vestry is chaired by the incumbent or other member of the clergy officiating in the parish. Select vestry members are responsible for making decisions on matters of general concern and importance to the parish including deciding how parish funds are to be applied.

The select vestry meets at times fixed by the members or by the diocesan synod. Special meetings may be convened at any time by the chairperson or the churchwardens. In 2023 the Select Vestry met 8 times during the year and the average attendance was 70%.

Compliance with Public Benefit

The Parish has given careful consideration to the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland's guidance on public benefit to ensure that the actives entered into during the year have helped to achieve the Parish's objectives and activities, as well as providing public benefit.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Report and the statement of receipts and payments and statement of assets and liabilities in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

The law applicable to charities in Northern Ireland with Income of less than £250,000 requires the trustees to prepare a statement of receipts and payments and a statement of assets and liabilities for each financial year.

The trustees are responsible for keeping accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the Parish's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the assets and liabilities of the Parish. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Parish and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities







1. Accounting policies

Set out below are the principal accounting policies which have been adopted in the compilation of the Receipts and Payments Account and the Statement of Assets and Liabilities

(a) Receipts and Payments Account

All items of income and expenditure included within the Receipts and Payments Account have been accounted for on a cash receipts basis.

(b) Statement of Assets and Liabilities

(i) Assets retained for the Parish's own use

The assets of the Parish, retained for its own use comprise:-

- Church Buildings and Graveyard
- Parish Hall
- Rectory
- Old Rectory
- Glebe land

The Church Building and Graveyard are deemed to be Heritage assets as defined by the Charities SORP (FRS102). These Heritage assets are not included in the statement of assets and liabilities as information on the cost or valuation is not available and such information cannot be obtained at a cost commensurate with the benefit to the users of the accounts and to the parish.

The Parish Hall is not included in the statement of assets and liabilities as information on the cost or valuation is not available and such information cannot be obtained at a cost commensurate with the benefit to the users of the accounts and to the parish.

The Rectory is valued at domestic rateable value as at 1 January 2017

The Old Rectory is valued at cost price when purchased from RCB approximately 20 years ago.

The Glebe land has been recognised at a value which the select Vestry deem to represent the estimate fair value of the property at 1 January 2017.

No depreciation has been provided on these buildings as the current estimated residual value is not less than its carrying value and the remaining useful life currently exceeds 50 years.

ii) Investments

Fixed asset investments comprising investment properties, investments in equities (ordinary shares) and investment in RCB/CIT Unit Trusts are initially recorded at cost and are then subsequently stated at fair value at each year end date. Investments in unquoted investments are recorded at cost and are assessed annually for impairment.

Trustees' Annual Report for the year ended 31 December 2023

The trustees present the annual report and statements of Receipts and Payments and Assets and Liabilities for Kilcronaghan Parish Church for the year ended 2023.

Objectives and Activities

The charitable purpose of the Church of Ireland is the advancement of religion.

The principal function of Kilcronaghan Parish Church is to support the advancement of the Christian religion by promoting, through the work of Kilcronaghan Parish Church the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. Being open to and engaging with society as a whole and offering support for those needing help are fundamental to the practical delivery of the benefits of Christianity.

As a result of activity in the pursuit of the advancement of the Christian religion, Kilcronaghan Parish Church has custody of property and of records, materials and artefacts of significance to the cultural and religious heritage and maintenance of which is undertaken by the select vestry of Kilcronaghan Parish Church.

Achievements, Performance & Public Benefit

Kilcronaghan Parish Church is under the incumbency of the Reverend Rosemary Diffin. As a church we provide a weekly service of Morning Prayer, Evening Prayer and a once per month service of Holy Communion. We also provide for baptisms, weddings, funerals and pastoral support.

The year began with the clearing of the parish hall in preparation for renovation work to be carried out. This began in early February and continued until September when the hall was finally opened on 30th September by the Rt. Revd. Andrew Forster, Bishop of Derry and Raphoe.

During this time our organisations met in the church, the Mc Kinney Hall or the Orange Hall

During Lent we had a Lenten service every Wednesday and special services during Holy Week. We were delighted to be able to resume our dawn service on Easter Sunday.

Our prayer fellowship meets on a Wednesday evening followed by a Bible study.

In June a special afternoon tea party was held in the grounds of the rectory to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles . We were entertained by Tamlaghtmore Silver Band. Bouncy castles were provided for the entertainment of the children.

The Connect group continues to meet every Thursday morning – a community coffee morning followed by a talk or activity one week and on alternate weeks a community soup lunch. An excursion took place to Dobbies new garden centre at Junction One.

The Sunday School excursion took place in June.

After the opening of the parish hall we had a Gospel Concert organised by Eric Drennan.

Our usual Harvest and Carol services took place and some special songs of praise services when we invited local bands to accompany the hymn singing. Evening services resumed with monthly café church, songs of praise, service of the Word and a communion service.

The GFS restarted with a Big Night back and in October a Lite Party was held.

Several special services were held during the year including one where the Revd Rosie was inaugurated as Diocesan Chaplain of the GFS and a fundraising service for the Air Ambulance by Knockloughrim Accordion Band.

Items of food were collected during the year and given to the local food bank.

The prayer fellowship resumed in September and this was followed by a number of different Bible courses.

The church continues to support 6 mission partners and other charities. Special collections were taken up for the Bishops' Appeal for Turkey/ Syria and donations were collected for Samaritans' Purse.

A number of fundraising events were held during the year for our new hall fund. These included a sponsored walk by our rector and her husband Ronnie from Coast to Coast across England and a sponsored fast by a parishioner. At the end of November a very successful Christmas Tree Festival was organised and our annual Tractor Run was held in December. The tractor run donations went to the Bishops' Appeal for the Middle East

Our Child Protection Policy is in accordance with the Safeguarding Trust policies of the Church of Ireland.

Financial Review

Going Concern

The trustees have reviewed the budgets for the year ahead and are satisfied that there are adequate funds in place to ensure that the Parish can continue its activities and the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2023 can be signed off as a going concern.

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document and Constitution of the Charity

Chapter III of the Constitution of the Church of Ireland governs Parishes and Parochial Organisation. The Select Vestry members are the Charity Trustees

Recruitment and Appointment of Select Vestry (Trustees)

All members of the Church of Ireland who are over the age of 18 and are either resident within the parish or live elsewhere but have been accustomed members of the congregation for at least three months, may register as members of the general vestry of the parish, allowing them to attend and vote at meetings of the general vestry and to stand for election to the select vestry. Meetings of the general vestry are held at least once a year. The Select Vestry is elected as part of this General Vestry meeting. The Select Vestry will hold their positions for a period of one year. Select Vestry members may be re-elected annually and there is no limit on the number of terms which may be served.

Pay and Remuneration

The Rector is not paid directly by the Parish. A monthly assessment is paid to the Diocese which comprises Stipend, Locomotory Allowance, Employer's National Insurance and Employers Clergy Pension Contributions.

Organisational Structure

The select vestry is responsible for the day to day management of the parish. The select vestry consists of the member of the clergy serving in the parish, the churchwardens, the glebe wardens and generally not more than twelve other members of the general vestry elected at the General Vestry.

The select vestry is chaired by the incumbent or other member of the clergy officiating in the parish. Select vestry members are responsible for making decisions on matters of general concern and importance to the parish including deciding how parish funds are to be applied.

The select vestry meets at times fixed by the members or by the diocesan synod. Special meetings may be convened at any time by the chairperson or the churchwardens. In 2023 the Select Vestry met 8 times during the year and the average attendance was 70%.

Compliance with Public Benefit

The Parish has given careful consideration to the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland's guidance on public benefit to ensure that the activities entered into during the year have helped to achieve the Parish's objectives and activities, as well as providing public benefit.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities


The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Report and the statement of receipts and payments and statement of assets and liabilities in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

The law applicable to charities in Northern Ireland with Income of less than £250,000 requires the trustees to prepare a statement of receipts and payments and a statement of assets and liabilities for each financial year.

The trustees are responsible for keeping accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the Parish's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the assets and liabilities of the Parish. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Parish and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Kilcronaghan Parish Church





Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2022

1. Accounting policies

Set out below are the principal accounting policies which have been adopted in the compilation of the Receipts and Payments Account and the Statement of Assets and Liabilities

(a) Receipts and Payments Account

All items of income and expenditure included within the Receipts and Payments Account have been accounted for on a cash receipts basis.

(b) Statement of Assets and Liabilities

(i) *Assets retained for the Parish's own use*

The assets of the Parish, retained for its own use comprise:-

- Church Buildings and Graveyard
- Parish Hall
- Rectory
- Old Rectory
- Glebe land

The Church Building and Graveyard are deemed to be Heritage assets as defined by the Charities SORP (FRS102). These Heritage assets are not included in the statement of assets and liabilities as information on the cost or valuation is not available and such information cannot be obtained at a cost commensurate with the benefit to the users of the accounts and to the parish.

The Parish Hall is not included in the statement of assets and liabilities as information on the cost or valuation is not available and such information cannot be obtained at a cost commensurate with the benefit to the users of the accounts and to the parish.

The Rectory is valued at domestic rateable value as at 1 January 2017

The Old Rectory is valued at cost price when purchased from RCB approximately 20 years ago.

The Glebe land has been recognised at a value which the select Vestry deem to represent the estimate fair value of the property at 1 January 2017.

No depreciation has been provided on these buildings as the current estimated residual value is not less than its carrying value and the remaining useful life currently exceeds 50 years.

ii) Investments

Fixed asset investments comprising investment properties, investments in equities (ordinary shares) and investment in RCB/CIT Unit Trusts are initially recorded at cost and are then subsequently stated at fair value at each year end date. Investments in unquoted investments are recorded at cost and are assessed annually for impairment.

The parish paid expenses of £4,549.35 relating to the running costs of the glebe house which is occupied by the rector. The rector also received an office allowance of £663 for the year. No trustee received any remuneration during the year. No trustee or a person related to a trustee had any personal interest in any contract or transaction entered into by the charity during the year.

17. Governance Costs

Governance costs of £400 were incurred during the year of which £400 relates to fees paid to the independent examiner. Governance costs are included within Administration costs in the Receipts and Payments Account.

Trustees' Annual Report for the year ended 2022

The trustees present the annual report and statements of Receipts and Payments and Assets and Liabilities for Kilcronaghan Parish Church for the year ended 2022

Objectives and Activities

The charitable purpose of the Church of Ireland is the advancement of religion.

The principal function of Kilcronaghan Parish Church is to support the advancement of the Christian religion by promoting, through the work of Kilcronaghan Parish Church the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. Being open to and engaging with society as a whole and offering support for those needing help are fundamental to the practical delivery of the benefits of Christianity.

As a result of activity in the pursuit of the advancement of the Christian religion, Kilcronaghan Parish Church has custody of property and of records, materials and artefacts of significance to the cultural and religious heritage and maintenance of which is undertaken by the select vestry of Kilcronaghan Parish Church.

Achievements, Performance & Public Benefit

Kilcronaghan Parish Church is under the incumbency of the Reverend Rosemary Diffin. As a church we provide a weekly service of Morning Prayer, a twice monthly service of Evening Prayer and a once per month service of Holy Communion. We also provide for baptisms, weddings, funerals and pastoral support.

This year, because of an increase in Covid 19cases the annual Bible Week organised by the three churches had to be postponed. It was held in the church at the end of November when the speaker was the Rt. Revd Andrew Forster. When we were unable to have services in the church, the rector had recorded a service every week to put up on face book and u tube. This ministry has continued even though normal services have resumed. CDs of the service are also handed out to those who do not use face book. Each morning, a thought for the day –a bible verse is put on face book followed by a gospel song or hymn.

During Lent we had a Lenten service every Wednesday and special services during Holy Week. We were delighted to be able to resume our dawn service on Easter Sunday. This was followed by a parish breakfast in the parish hall.

Our prayer fellowship meets on a Wednesday evening followed by a Bible study

In June a special afternoon tea party was held in the grounds of the rectory to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. We were entertained by Tamlaghtmore Silver Band. A Jubilee tree was also planted at the rectory and another was planted in the church grounds.

The Connect group continues to meet every Thursday morning – a community coffee morning followed by a talk or activity one week and on alternate weeks a community soup lunch. An excursion took place to Galgorm Garden Centre.

The Sunday School excursion took place in June.

At the end of August a Holiday Bible Club/Summer School was held for Primary School children. This was followed by a special service on the Sunday with a BBQ for everyone and bouncy castles for the children.

When Covid restrictions eased we were delighted that many of our church organisations re-opened. The GFS started the season with a Big Night Back and at Hallowe'en the church organised a Light Party.

The Prayer Fellowship resumed in September and this was followed by an Alpha Course.

Our usual Harvest and Carol services took place and some special songs of praise services when we invited local bands to accompany the hymn singing.

Items of food were collected during the year and given to the local food bank.

The church continues to support 6 mission partners and other charities. A special collection was taken up for the Bishops' Appeal for Ukraine, another for generators for Ukraine and shoe boxes and donations were collected for Samaritans' Purse.

A number of fundraising events were held during the year for our new hall fund. These included a sale of items donated to us, a daffodil tea and a craft and dessert night. Our annual Tractor Run was held in December and a sponsored fast by one of our parishioners.

Our Child Protection Policy is in accordance with the Safeguarding Trust policies of the Church of Ireland.

As a result of the pandemic the church has implemented a special protocol to ensure the safety of our parishioners.
