Purpose

We are an organisation for youth in the Killyman area. Our charitable purpose is promoting the development of young people in achieving their full physical, intellectual, social and spiritual potentials, as individuals, as responsible citizens and as members of their local, national and international communities.

Finance

Incomings for the year amounted to £5698 and outgoings amounted to £6066 with a closing balance of £3472. Our charitable activities are funded by members' subscriptions and Education authority grant. Funds are retained in Killyman Scout Support Group bank account and two signatories are required for all payments.

The accounts for the year ending March 2023 have been prepared on a receipts and payments basis and independently examined in line with the requirements of the Charities (Accounts and reports) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015.
