## **Finance**

Incomings for the year amounted to £4335 and outgoings amounted to £3073 with a closing balance of £4735. Our charitable activities are funded by members' subscriptions and Education Authority grant. Funds are retained in Killyman Scout Support Group bank account and two signatories are required for all payments.

The accounts for the year ending March 2024 have been prepared on a receipts and payments basis and independently examined in line with the requirements of the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015.
