The objects of The Club are to promote the sport and recreation of Canoeing, particularly competitive canoeing, and the involvement of young people in the sport.

The public benefits of the Club activities are opportunities for members of the public to participate in the sport and recreation of Canoeing, particularly competitive canoeing, and the involvement of young people in the sport. The benefits of this participation include improved skills, strength and conditioning, fitness, personal achievement and development and volunteering opportunities.

These benefits can be demonstrated by achievement of recognised awards of British Canoeing, by participation in canoeing events in the United Kingdom and abroad, by improvements in fitness and skills of individuals demonstrated by performance of individuals including medal winning performances in competitions and progression through divisional systems towards elite level. These are recorded in our annual report, as well as in publicly available competition results, etc.

The purposes of our charity may lead to the following harm:

As with any sport there is a small risk of injury. This is minimised by use of experienced and qualified coaches and appropriate risk assessment and mitigation. The residual risk is outweighed by the benefits of participation in sport through improved skills and fitness levels and the proven health benefits of regular exercise.

The charity's beneficiaries are those members of the public who choose to make use of the opportunities we offer to come canoeing with us, and those who join as members for longer term opportunities.

The only private benefit flowing from the purpose is to those who supply the equipment we have to buy and any facilities we have to pay to use, and this is incidental and necessary because without equipment and facilities we could not offer our activities.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

2024 was another reasonably successful year for the club. Financially there was a small cash surplus (£37 on turnover of £3300) , although this has to be viewed against continuing depreciation in our predominantly elderly fleet of boats and paddles.

Thanks to the generosity of Lennie and Drew Totten we have added 2 competitive K1s to the club fleet at minimal cost, and we have purchased 3 new general purpose paddles to allow some of the 'antiques' to be retired.

Regular twice weekly Club sessions at Lough Henney over the summer season were well attended with up to 20 paddlers on the water. We also ran sessions on Lough Henney most weekends in winter, together with swimming pool sessions in Newtownards and paddling machine sessions on winter evenings.

We added 17 new members and although several 2023 members did not renew by the end of 2024 our membership had reached 47, slightly up on 2023. Membership is 28 males and 19 females with ages from 10-70+. Junior numbers have increased but are still lower than we would like with 9 boys and 4 girls.

We again ran a Paddlesport Safety Course with 7 participants. We now have 16 members with some formal certification: 2 Coaches, 3 Instructors, 2 Leaders and 9 more with basic safety training. 4 of these renewed First Aid qualifications in 2024: all of this training was undertaken at the individual paddlers' expense.

Meteor Waterski Club have started reconstruction of their jetty: on completion this should be much more useful to us. Our 2021 investments in the canoe rack and movable jetty remain fully utilised

Most of our activities have been at Lough Henney, but we did have a successful club trip to Scotland as well as the Bann, Blackwater and Lagan and paddlers also took part in several CANI Recreational paddles. We also provided safety cover for the Cancer Focus New Years Day swim at Crawfordsburn.

We wish to thank CANI for the continuing loan of development racing boats and paddles for use by the Club in introducing people to the sport, and for loan of paddling machines for the juniors to use for winter training at home: this is in addition to the Club machine which has been widely used for coaching both club members and other CANI members.

A total of 14 (8 Junior and 6 senior) club members paddled competitively in Canoeing Ireland Events in 2024 and BCC members entered all 10 ranking races.

Charlie Doherty and Alex Ng won Canoeing Ireland Division events with all the other juniors winning medals in their classes.

10 BCC paddlers competed in our NI Championship event which had both 5km and Sprint Race Events with Charlie and Jake winning overall unfortunately the unpredictable weather in late September meant that the event had to be postponed from the original date and reduced in scope. Afton Fitzhenry continues to train full-time with the British Team and compete Internationally.


