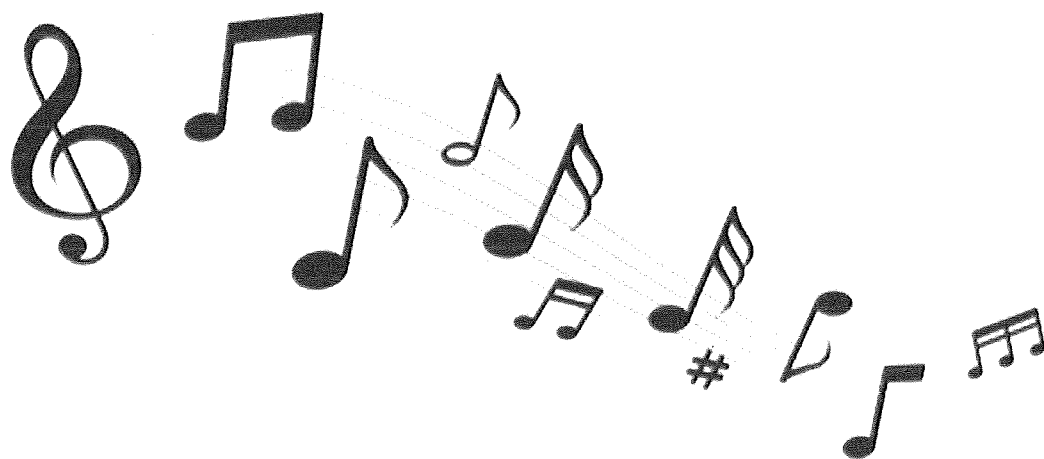

Annual report

Armagh City Choir: Report by Chair: Wed 22nd May 2024

- The start of the new choral season in Sept. saw us welcome some new members to the Choir; namely, Clare to the sopranos; Kevin to the basses and Alan & Robert to the tenors. We are delighted to have them on board & hope they have enjoyed their first musical 'voyage' with us.
- The first four months [of the new season] saw us cover a wide range of music. Michael & Rodney introduced us to Dvorak's *Mass in D major* - a work never sung by the Choir before; also to a work by Tim Knight, a leading contemporary English composer, *The Lorica of Saint Patrick* – a piece hardly ever sung by anyone before! We also had our Christmas music including *Fantasia on Christmas Carols* by Vaughan Williams; *Bethle'm Baby*; *Gabriel's Message*; *Nativity Carol* by John Rutter & *O Holy Night* by Adam. It seemed a bit strange & almost comical to be singing Christmas music in October but Michael soon got us into the festive swing – helped of course by his white bottle of water!!
- Armagh Borough Council's pre-Christmas 'Georgian Day' soon came round. Once again we entertained the general public with Christmas carols accompanied by Armagh Old Boys' Silver band. Thankfully it wasn't as cold as in past years so we avoided becoming frozen on the spot! I was disappointed, though, not to see the snow machine in action from the roof of the Library...maybe next time!
- Our annual Christmas concert on Friday 8th December in St. Patrick's Church of Ireland Cathedral secured an excellent turnout. The audience very much enjoyed our festive programme. The *Fantasia on Christmas Carols* with Baritone soloist Aaron O'Hare and *O Holy Night* with our talented Soprano soloist and choir member, Clover being the highlights. We also enjoyed inspiring Christmas readings by various choir members, including one in Irish. 'The Three Kings' with soloist Aaron O'Hare, 'Christmas Cradle Song' and 'Love came down at Christmas'' also proved popular – as did some enchanting organ music by Phillip Elliott. As is the

custom the audience joined the choir in singing the Christmas hymns which made it a very engaging evening all round. The concert concluded with 'Hark! The herald angels sing - a fabulous sound in the fine acoustics of the cathedral. We received many compliments from members of the audience afterwards.

- On Friday 9th Feb we had a great night of quizzing & craic at Armagh Golf Club for our annual fundraiser. Michael & Audrey as ever did a fantastic job with a mind-numbing variety of questions inc. a stamp conundrum for Norma. As always Choir Members were very generous in providing gifts for the raffle & we raised the very pleasing sum of £900, a fine effort all round.
- In the New Year while preparing for our collaboration with Ulster Touring Opera in Feb. Rebekah Coffey & Catherine Donnelly tutored us in both the music and pronunciation of the three Italian & French opera choruses: *Habanera*; *Brindisi* and the *Chorus of the Hebrew Slaves*. It was a pleasure to work with professionals and share their expertise. We also enjoyed learning *Dido's Lament: 'With drooping wings'*: a very moving melody which suited the Choir's blend of voices beautifully.
- The Ulster Touring Opera project 'Opera & Orchards' (*inc. the 'Armagh CiderZero' launch*) on Saturday 10th Feb was a real success. The choir's rendition of the choruses formed a perfect complement to the UTO soloists: Sarah Richmond (Mezzo Soprano); Catherine Donnelly (Soprano) & Aaron O'Hare (Tenor) who performed that evening. We were also accompanied by the splendid Ulster String Quartet.
 - Some Choir feedback on the event was: "*It was a thrill to sing alongside such young & talented soloists & have an opportunity to perform opera music that normally would not come our way.*"
 - I was sorry to have missed it but was too busy falling over on a ski slope. Luckily I came back in one piece!
- In mid-Feb we received good news from ABC Council that we had been awarded a £2k financial assistance grant within the Arts Project Fund

category. However it soon became apparent that costs for a 25-person orchestra & soloists had gone up substantially since we applied for funding. This now meant that we might end up with a £6k operating loss, so we had to opt for organ accompaniment only for the Dvorak concert in May.

- This change involved re-submitting revised costs to the Council and resulted in the award of a £1.3k Grant reflecting our adjusted expenditure. I would like to thank Trish sincerely for her kind assistance in speaking directly with the Head of the ABC Financial Assistance Programme, Valerie Leatham, to explain the cost challenges facing us as a charity & securing agreement on our revised offer by the end of March. *(We have since been awarded this figure, with just the vouching process to be actioned within six weeks.)*
- And now - our Spring Concert! What a marvellous night the 11th May was! - to perform *Cantate Domino & Elegia* by Jenkins again as well as our premiere of Dvorak's D major Mass. It was a privilege to sing with our superb professional soloists: Kelli-Ann, (Masterson); Margaret, (Bridge); Peter and Rory.
- Special thanks also go to Michael, our Musical Director & Philip Elliott, our Organist. They surprised us all, not least my Dad Roger, with a lovely dedication for his many years service as Assistant Conductor to the choir. It was a wonderful moment that I shall not forget, Michael's kind [& thoughtful] tribute, the beauty of the majestic organ music all while admiring the beautifully-coloured stained glass of the Cathedral lit up by the sunshine. I know that Mum will have been with us in spirit too. I was trying not to get emotional saying to myself, *"you have to sing Dvorak in a minute!...keep calm and carry on!"*
- Finally my sincere thanks to all our terrific Committee Members for their invaluable support & wise advice throughout the season.

- **Trish** for helping with our renewed Grant & for all her hard work with the Seating plan & organising the Staging.
- **Rodger/Dad** for compiling Programmes for both our Christmas & Spring concerts....
- **Kathy** and **Eleanor** without whom we simply couldn't function;
- Our ever-patient and long suffering accompanist **Rodney**, who must be able to book a holiday in the Caribbean by now with all the fivers Michael has promised him over the year!
- and of course our wonderfully-talented Director, **Michael**. We really miss him tonight and we all send him our thanks and good wishes for a speedy recovery!

For myself I thank you for choosing me as Chairperson this past season. It has been a wonderful privilege to serve this Choir, which has such a high reputation in the city and the province, especially since it will soon be nearly as old as I am! Thank you all!

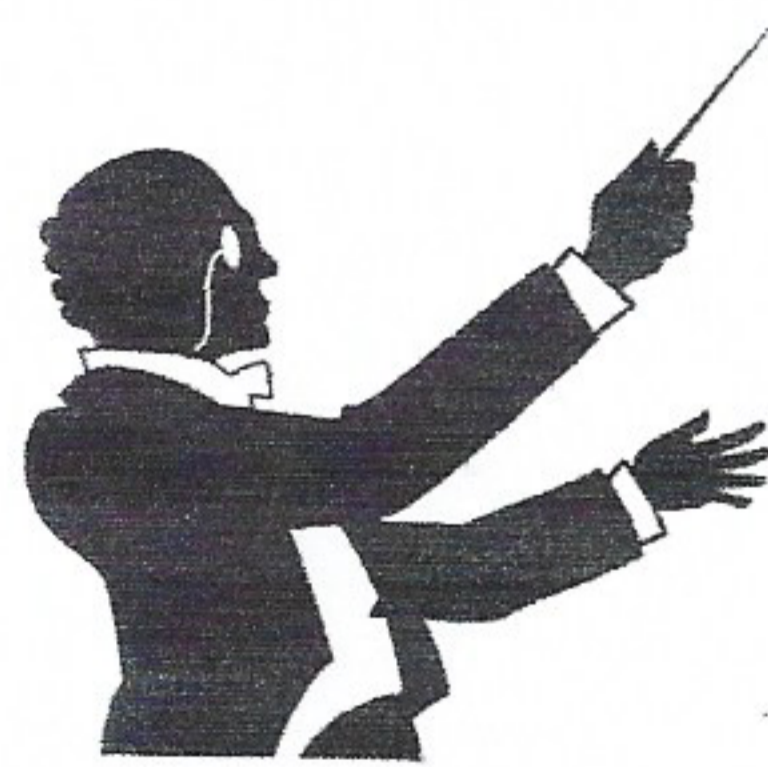

Chairperson's Report Armagh City Choir AGM

2023

Thank you all for attending the AGM, it is good to see such a great turnout.

I hope the change of venue did not cause too many problems for people, and you all found your way here with ease. The Golf Club were sorry they were not able to facilitate us this year — they were told only last Wednesday morning that there would be no electricity on that part of the Newry Road for the entire day, so we are indebted to Kathy, who pulled out the stops, and organised caterers and this lovely venue with just 7 days notice. Thank you Kathy.

After all the drama with Covid, this year reverted back to the norm, and the year progressed very much within the model that had become established over previous seasons.

We once again participated in Armagh's flagship Georgian Festival, always a lovely event which helps to get us in the mood for Christmas.

This was swiftly followed by our Christmas Concert in the Church of Ireland Cathedral. After two years of restrictions due to Covid, it was wonderful to sing carols, and just enjoy the festivities once again.

February saw us hold our annual fundraiser, which this year took the form of a quiz in the County Armagh Golf Club. The event was extremely well attended and members of the choir were very generous in donating gorgeous gifts for the raffle. We managed to raise a very useful total of £997.00 which

helped us pay for the May concert. We are indebted to Michael and Audrey who acted as quiz setters, and question masters. I think we all enjoyed the evening thoroughly.

Finally on 13th May we held our annual Spring Concert, which topically this year featured a few of Handel's glorious Coronation Anthems together with Haydn's Nelson Mass. As ever we were accompanied by wonderful soloists and a superb orchestra and conducted as ever by Michael. It was a glorious evening, and the feedback from everyone concerned has been very positive.

This year we held an Extraordinary General Meeting in September to discuss issues around attendance at rehearsals. After much discussion, it was agreed that choir members would have to attend a minimum number of rehearsals to be eligible to sing in concerts.

A vote was taken, and it was overwhelmingly agreed that members should attend 75% of rehearsals to guarantee a place in the concert. It was also agreed that Michael as Musical Director could ask members not attaining this minimum attendance level to present for audition, and his decision as to who could sing would be final. The choir constitution was duly amended to include this clause- I would point out that since implementing this clause attendance has risen each week by approximately 10 people. Your cooperation with this is much appreciated.

The AGM is always the time to remember and honour past members of ACC who sadly are no longer with us.

I would like to pay tribute to Steve Hartley, who sadly died last October. For those of us who knew Steve, I think we would all agree that he was a Leviathan. The House of Commons bestows the longest serving Member as 'The

Father of the House'. I think many of us felt Steve was the 'Father of the Choir'. He was a founder member, joining the choir at its inception back in 1985/6. He was also our first Treasurer, and he held that role for many years. He was also a pretty useful Bass. Until relatively recently he walked weekly with the Wednesday Walkers (who now walk on a Tuesday, which leads to much confusion for my husband John), during which walks Steve regaled us with stories of his time in the RAF during the last war, and where he always carried a penknife with him. Why? Well, he used to cut off a piece of straight holly tree and whittle us girls a lovely walking stick. He was very special to many of us, and it was a great honour when his son and daughter asked the choir to sing at his funeral.

Finally, I would like to thank a number of people:

Jenny and Maggie, for successfully undertaking to complete our grant application to the local council.

Roger, for yet again working behind the scenes, and producing our beautiful concert programme.

David Braziel, for designing the flyer, programme cover.

Rodney, for accompanying us each week, and giving us a sneaky note, just when we really need it.

The committee, for helping and supporting me during this past year, with special thanks to Kathy our Secretary, Eleanor our Treasurer and Jenny our vice-Chair who were always just at the end of the phone, and never once said no to me for anything I asked of them.

The Royal School Armagh, for the use of their premises, and particularly Colin Magwood the caretaker who looks after us so well (in the background — we never see him).

The Dean and Chapter of the Church of Ireland Cathedral, for once again allowing us to use the glorious setting of the Cathedral.

Armagh City, Banbridge and Craigavon Borough Council for the grant of £2,000 towards our concert

And last but by no means least to our wonderful Musical Director Michael. I think I speak for everyone when I say how much we all enjoy Wednesday nights. I know that I look forward to choir each week, and always ensure that Wednesday evenings are kept free. Thank you, Michael, for making us laugh with your jokes, for being so patient, when you have to go over something complex for the thousandth time, and for teaching us some glorious music. Thank you from each and every one of us.

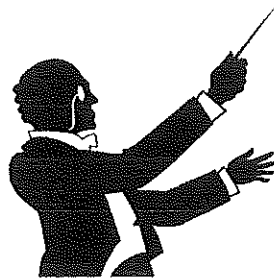
