A summary of the Charity's main activities to further its purposes for the public benefit and the main achievements in the year

This year we had 10 Brownies in our unit. The girls made calendars and celebrated Chinese New Year by trying Chinese food, making lanterns and doing a quiz. The Brownies went to Lorne Outdoor activity centre and enjoyed the climbing wall, high ropes, zip line and bushcraft skills. The girls enjoyed craft activities for easter, mother's day, remembrance day and Christmas. We held a coronation party and joined with the Rainbow and Guide units to have fun with bouncy castles, crafts, games and food. The Brownies also made cards for the new King which were posted to Buckingham Palace. The girls completed a coronation badge that was developed by another guiding unit. The girls enjoyed a weekend away at Crawfordsburn Scout centre where they took part in outdoor activities such as archery, zip line and grass sledging. We had a promotional stand at our church in September where we advertised our organisation and tried to recruit new members. The girls enjoyed a movie night at the church hall in November and went to the cinema in December. We also had a visit from jumping clay where the rainbow unit joined us to make a Christmas scene. Throughout the year the girls worked on our programme and achieved their Know Myself Theme Award. In September they started their Feel Good badge which they also achieved in December.

A review of the Charity's financial position at the end of the year

At the start of the 2023 we had a balance of £2346.42 and the end of the year we had a balance of £1806.05. Our main income came from subs paid by our members of £544 and an education authority grant of £800. Our main outgoings were annual subs of £648 followed by transport of £420. Other expenses included books, badges, materials for badge work, craft, Lorne Fun day and Christmas celebrations.
