We had Calm for Kids visit the Rangers for 3 weeks to allow them to complete their Self-Care badge as part of their "Be Well" theme award.

Our final event before the summer concluded with a joint BBQ between Rainbows, Brownies, Guides and Rangers across the District where we had bouncy castles before breaking up for the holidays. This was in conjunction with the Platinum Jubilee Celebrations.

Rangers took part in several Christmas crafts and concluded for Christmas with organising Glitterbug for their Leadership qualifications for Brownies and Guides to create slime and reindeer food and held a party with Rainbows and Brownies.
