**A summary of the Charity's main activities to further its purposes for the public benefit and the main achievements in the year**

Each week the programme varies from craft, games, outings, badge work and welcoming visitors to the unit. Over 2019 we have had a Yoga session, Wildlife talk, specialist Christmas craft visitor and a visit from Santa. We have used the Rainbow badge book to complete badges on the family tree, agility and animal lover. We have taken part in two church services to celebrate Founders Day and Christmas. A local businessman donated Easter eggs to be given to the girls.

A session layout is made each week by leaders and from that we supply parents with a calendar of events. Sessions start with all girls and leaders getting into a Rainbow circle, roll is taken and dues are completed. We then have a quick informal chat about what the girls have done that week. This takes approx. 5 minutes. We then start our session which lasts approx. 50 minutes. Then to close we again get into a circle and sing our Goodnight Rainbow song.

There was no harm flowing from the Charity and there was no private benefit.

**A review of the Charity's financial position at the end of the year**

At the beginning of the year our opening balance was £404.58. Our main income comes from annual subscriptions of weekly dues and census fees, this amounted to £1236. We also received a donation of £200 from our Brownie unit as part of a split grant. Our biggest expenditure was our annual subscription fees of £897. Our other costs account for craft materials, badges and a healthy snack. At year end 2019 our closing bank balance was £591.34 with a small petty cash of £16.84.
