

#### **STRUCTURE AND MANAGEMENT**

##### **The Kirk Session**

The charity trustees of the congregation are the members of its Kirk Session. Under the congregation's governing document, The Code, the book of the constitution and government of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland, the Kirk Session seeks to watch over and promote the spiritual interest of the congregation and of persons not connected with any congregation who are within its bounds. It ensures pastoral care is in place in the congregation and seeks to further the contribution of the Church to Christian witness and service in the local community. The Kirk Session has delegated to its Congregational Committee the temporal affairs of the congregation including administering all funds and property belonging to the congregation. Members of the Kirk Session are ex-officio members of the Congregational Committee.

The Kirk Session consists of the ordained minister and the ruling elders of the congregation. All members are entitled to propose, speak and exercise equal votes at meetings, except that the Moderator, the minister in active duty in the congregation, has no deliberative but only a casting vote.

Stated meetings of the Kirk session are held at least twice in each year or as appropriate.

To be chosen for the office of the eldership in the congregation a person must be a voting member and a regular attendant on its ordinances. The selection of those proposed to be called to the office can be either by the congregation or by the Kirk Session. Members are elected if they obtain two-thirds of those who vote.

##### **Presbytery**

Under the Presbyterian Church in Ireland form of governance the corporate oversight of a congregation is the responsibility of a Presbytery which superintends generally the spiritual and temporal affairs of the congregations assigned to it by the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland. Kilkinamurry congregation of the Presbyterian Church has been assigned to the Iveagh Presbytery of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland. The membership of the Presbytery consists mainly of the active ministers of congregations assigned to it by the General Assembly, ministers who have retired from active duty and an elder appointed by the Kirk Session of the congregation.

### **The General Assembly**

The General Assembly is the supreme court of the Church, representing in one body the whole Church and acting as its supreme legislative, administration and judicial authority, in dealing with all matters brought before it. The General Assembly is normally constituted during the first week in June for worship and to conduct its business. At the end of business, it is dissolved. The membership of the General Assembly consists mainly of the active ministers of each congregation, retired ministers and a representative elder appointed by the Kirk Session of each congregation.

### **DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE**

The charitable purpose of the congregation is the advancement of religion.

Kilkinamurry congregation of the Presbyterian Church is a congregation of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland. The Presbyterian Church in Ireland, as a Reformed Church within the wider body of Christ is grounded in the Scriptures, and exists to love and honour God through faith in His Son and by the power of His Spirit, and to enable its members to play their part in fulfilling God's mission to our world.

The congregation's mission purpose is to:

- Worship God and glorify His holy name.
- Proclaim the Good News of the Gospel through word and life so that people of all ages are drawn to a personal saving faith in Jesus Christ.
- Develop Discipleship as we grow together as followers of Christ through Worship, Bible Study, prayer and mutual encouragement and support.
- Experience Fellowship as God's people, united in a common faith in Jesus as Saviour and Lord and committed to one another in practical love.
- Express our faith through Acts of Service – using the gifts and abilities God has given each of us to serve His purposes both in the church and in the wider world.

*The congregation aims to live out its Mission and Vision as a family of God's people by being:*

- A Gospel centred church - where the Good News of Jesus Christ and his death and resurrection for sinners is proclaimed. We aim to see people of all ages come to know Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour and make Him known.
- A family church where everybody, from the youngest to the oldest are welcome and can feel at home.
- A community church. We are part of the community and we seek to reach out to and serve the members of the local community. Everyone is welcome to our services and activities.
- A friendly church. We would like to assure you that you will receive a warm welcome at any of our services and organisations. We would be delighted to see you.

### **ACTIVITIES AND OBJECTIVES**

The congregation meets for worship every Sunday and visitors are welcome to join. The Sacrament of the Lords Supper is observed on several occasions during the year and all those who have been baptised and who have made a profession of faith in the Lord Jesus Christ are admitted to the Lord's Supper. The congregation holds regular bible study meetings and has a wide range of organisations including

- Bible Study and Prayer Group
- Bowling Club
- Boys Brigade
- Girls Brigade
- Good Companions
- Mothers and Toddlers
- Presbyterian Women
- Sunday School
- Youth Fellowship

### **ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE**

#### **Worship and prayer**

The congregation normally meets for worship each Sunday at 12.30 pm. During the week the Bible Study provides an opportunity for members to meet together for fellowship, to study the scriptures and for a time of prayer.

As well as our regular services during the year we gave thanks for faithful service and seek to comfort those who had been bereaved during the year.

At 31 December 2023 there were 61 communicant members and 58 families connected with the congregation. The average week attendance at morning worship is 40-50 at present.

#### **Pastoral care**

Members of the congregation who are unable to attend church due to sickness or age are visited on a regular basis by the minister, elders or by one of the congregation's pastoral visitors.

#### **Mission and outreach**

The Congregation continues to support a number of missions and charities.

The congregation supports the United Appeal for Mission which is a central fund of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland. This fund enables congregations to support the wider mission of the denomination and to do mission and outreach on a denominational basis beyond what the congregation could do on its own. The United Appeal Fund provides financial support for mission personnel at home and overseas, assists congregations with the deployment of locally based staff, enables church planting, provides grant support for the upkeep of church premises, assist with the running costs of Union Theological College, the Church's training college for ministry students, and financially supports congregations in the areas of worship, discipleship, global mission, outreach, leadership and pastoral care.

The congregation also contributes to the denominations annual World Development Appeal, Sunday School project and any other special appeals.

#### **Presbytery**

The congregation was represented at the regular meetings of Presbytery by our minister and / or one of the elders. This provides an important link between the congregations and the wider structures of the church.

#### **General Assembly**

The minister and one of our elders were nominated to attend the meeting of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland held in Assembly Buildings, Belfast, in June.

#### **Property**

No major repairs or refurbishments to our property were carried out this year.

#### **Organisations**

On Sunday mornings the Sunday School and Bible class meet from 11:30am - 12:30pm. During the year both groups met and studied different aspects of the bible and faith.

The Boys' Brigade normally meets in Drumgooland church hall from 6.45 -9.15pm each Monday evening (Sept-March/April). Different age groups are catered for ranging from Anchor Boys (P1-P4), Junior Section (P5-P7) and Company Section (Year 8-14). On average about 30 boys attend the BB. The organisation is part of BBNI and participates in activities organised within the wider organisation and Battalion.

Normally from September to April the Bowling Club meet each Thursday Evening in Drumgooland church hall. The Bowling Club has 15 plus members. They would regularly play against other local clubs, with matches taking place at Drumgooland Church Hall and at the premises of the other clubs.

From September to June on a Wednesday morning Drumgooland hall is used by our mothers and toddlers' group, "Little Acorns". 15 plus children and their carers would normally attend. The group would usually meet from 9.45am until 11.15am.

Once a month on Tuesday mornings Good Companions meet. 10-15 would normally attend with different speakers each month. During 2023 the Good Companions group met regularly with visiting speakers covering a range of topics. They also went on a number of arranged trips.

Each Friday evening the Girls' Brigade normally meets in the church from 7.15 -9.00pm (Sept-March/April). Different age groups are catered for ranging from Baby Explorers (3-5 years), Explorers (5-8 years,) Juniors (8-11), Seniors (12- 14 years), Brigaders (14-18 years). During 2023 the GB programme returned to normal with the group able to meet with no restrictions and a range of activities.

Our Youth Fellowship 'Ignite' meets fortnightly on Sunday evenings 7.00-8.15pm (Sept -June) alternating between Drumgooland church hall and Kilkinamurry. Ignite continued in 2023 to meet fortnightly and studied topics and programmes such as Discipleship Explored.

Presbyterian Women meet the last Tuesday evening of every month (Sept- April). 10-12 ladies normally attend with different speakers each month. A PW Service and Coffee Morning are held by the group to raise funds which go to support the work of Home & Overseas PW Projects and the work of our Deaconesses, Friendship House and the International Meeting Point in Belfast. Presbyterian Women's aim is to seek to encourage women to become disciples of Christ, to serve in love and unity in obedience to God, to live a Christian life and grow in spiritual maturity, being encouraged to serve using gifts, time and money.

**Volunteers**

The Trustees wish to acknowledge their deep appreciation of those who give freely of their time by serving on committees and helping with organisations and other church activities.

**PUBLIC BENEFIT STATEMENT**

The Presbyterian Church in Ireland meets the public benefit requirement by providing benefit to its members and the general public by making known the Christian Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ through the advancement of religion.

The direct benefits which flow from the purposes of the Church include the gaining of an understanding in Christian beliefs as set out in the Bible and in the Church's subordinate standards (the Westminster Confession of Faith and the Shorter and Larger Catechisms) leading to spiritual and moral development and opportunities for response to Bible teaching. In turn, this framework leads to practical expressions of Christian beliefs and standards in the local community such as through the care of those in need (including the sick, disabled and bereaved).

Generally, the above benefits are delivered locally by congregations and their members or are facilitated through presbyteries or are organised and delivered centrally. Local delivery is facilitated by central resources in almost all cases. Public access is made known through the use of noticeboards, printed material, press advertisement, websites, and social media or in other ways.

The benefits are demonstrated through regular evaluation of the services and informal and ad-hoc feedback from members, their families, and members of the public.

The purpose does not lead to harm. #### **STRUCTURE AND MANAGEMENT**

##### **The Kirk Session**

The charity trustees of the congregation are the members of its Kirk Session. Under the congregation's governing document, The Code, the book of the constitution and government of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland, the Kirk Session seeks to watch over and promote the spiritual interest of the congregation and of persons not connected with any congregation who are within its bounds. It ensures pastoral care is in place in the congregation and seeks to further the contribution of the Church to Christian witness and service in the local community. The Kirk Session has delegated to its Congregational Committee the temporal affairs of the congregation including administering all funds and property belonging to the congregation. Members of the Kirk Session are ex-officio members of the Congregational Committee.

The selection of those proposed to be called to the office can be either by the congregation or by the Kirk Session. Members are elected if they obtain two-thirds of those who vote.

##### **Presbytery**

Under the Presbyterian Church in Ireland form of governance the corporate oversight of a congregation is the responsibility of a Presbytery which superintends generally the spiritual and temporal affairs of the congregations assigned to it by the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland. The Boys' Brigade normally meets in Drumgooland church hall from 6.45 -9.15pm each Monday evening (Sept-March/April). Different age groups are catered for ranging from Anchor Boys (P1-P4), Junior Section (P5-P7) and Company Section (Year 8-14). On average about 30 boys attend the BB. The organisation is part of BBNI and participates in activities organised within the wider organisation and Battalion.

Normally from September to April the Bowling Club meet each Thursday Evening in Drumgooland church hall. The Bowling Club has 15 plus members. They would regularly play against other local clubs, with matches taking place at Drumgooland Church Hall and at the premises of the other clubs.

From September to June on a Wednesday morning Drumgooland hall is used by our mothers and toddlers' group, "Little Acorns". 15 plus children and their carers would normally attend. The group would usually meet from 9.45am until 11.15am.

Once a month on Tuesday mornings Good Companions meet. 10-15 would normally attend with different speakers each month. During 2022 the Good Companions group met regularly with visiting speakers covering a range of topics. They also went on a number of arranged trips.

Each Friday evening the Girls' Brigade normally meets in the church from 7.15 -9.00pm (Sept-March/April). Different age groups are catered for ranging from Baby Explorers (3-5 years), Explorers (5-8 years,) Juniors (8-11), Seniors (12- 14 years), Brigaders (14-18 years). During 2022 the GB programme returned to normal with the group able to meet with no restrictions and a range of activities.

Our Youth Fellowship 'Ignite' meets fortnightly on Sunday evenings 7.00-8.30pm (Sept -June) alternating between Drumgooland church hall and Kilkinamurry. Ignite continued in 2022 to meet fortnightly and studied topics and programmes such as Discipleship Explored.

Presbyterian Women meet the last Tuesday evening of every month (Sept- April). 10-12 ladies normally attend with different speakers each month. A PW Service and Coffee Morning are held by the group to raise funds which go to support the work of Home & Overseas PW Projects and the work of our Deaconesses, Friendship House and the International Meeting Point in Belfast. 



I have examined the digital records produced by General church a/c, Building Fund, Missions, PW, SS and other Investments a/c. I conducted a check of the information provided and totted income from the sources as laid out in the current a/c. I have also queried any items within the accounts produced to satisfy myself that they are correct and reflect what is shown on the individual reports.

My role is to state whether any material matters have come to my attention giving me cause to believe:

1. That accounting records were not kept in accordance with s63 of the Charities Act.
2. That the accounts do not comply with those accounting records.
3. That the accounts do not comply with the accounting requirements of the Charities Act.
4. That there is further information needed for a proper understanding of the accounts to be reached.

I have completed my examination and am satisfied that measures put in place last year and commented on in my report have been carried out to help with accurate reporting.

I am very pleased to see that the FWO has come back again to pre-covid levels which in turns aids extra income from Gift Aid. This is to be encouraged in the congregation for those who are tax-payers.

I also note there was a new piano purchased through the Building A/c and there was also a healthy donation made for its purchase. Kilkinamurry has been blessed with great givers.
