Everyone dressed in green, and we completed Irish craft and sampled soda bread and cheese. We had a Valentine's and Easter theme nights

Many craft activities have been completed and we have learnt new first aid skills as well as taking part in church Christmas and Remembrance Day services. Our first camp under canvas was a highlight for June 2024 attending Snores and S'mores with approximately 100 other brownies from units across ulster.

We finished off the year with a sausage sizzle at Lorne.
