Trustees' Annual Report for the year ended 31 December 2024

The trustees present the Annual Report and Statements of Receipts and Payments and Assets and Liabilities for Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Church of Ireland for the year ended 31 December 2024.

Objectives and Activities

The charitable purpose of the Church of Ireland is the advancement of religion.

The principal function of Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Church of Ireland Parish is to support the advancement of the Christian religion by promoting, through the work of Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Church of Ireland, the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. Being open to and engaging with society as a whole and offering support for those needing help are fundamental to the practical delivery of the benefits of Christianity.

As a result of activity in the pursuit of the advancement of the Christian religion, Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Church of Ireland has custody of property and of records, materials and artefacts of significance to the cultural and religious heritage and maintenance of which is undertaken by the select vestry of Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Church of Ireland.

Achievements, Performance & Public Benefit

Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Church of Ireland has weekly services on Sunday mornings and afternoons comprising of a mix of Holy Communion, Family Services, Baptism, Morning and Evening Prayer, Compline, Late Evening Office, the Litany with various other special services during the year eg Confirmation, Lenten, Harvest Thanksgivings, Advent and Christmas. Pastoral care is provided for parishioners and those in the wider community.

A range of other activities are provided by Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Parish either by the church directly or through various church organisations eg Sunday School, the Bridge youth group, Carers and Toddlers' Group; Junior and Senior choir, Mothers' Union, Junior Badminton and a range of uniformed children's groups: Rainbows, Brownies, Girl Guides and Beaver Scouts. Other groups regularly hire the church parish centre for Bowls, Women's Institute, Wednesday Club and Veterans' Group. The parish centre is given free of charge to all children's groups and also to the Christmas Lights' Association.

A number of parishioners serve on the Board of Governors of the local primary school and the Rector leads assemblies on a regular basis. The Parish also supports the work of Scripture Union which is active in many of the local junior and secondary schools.

The activities outlined above demonstrate how Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Parish continues to implement its charitable purposes (ie the advancement of religion) and meets the Public Benefit requirement by providing the Parish Centre free of charge to local community groups, contributing to the spiritual well-being of participants and the reinforcement of Christian values.

Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Parish has mitigated any potential harm through the implementation of the Church of Ireland Safeguarding Trust Policy.

The Parish has given careful consideration to the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland's guidance on public benefit to ensure that the actives entered into during the year have helped to achieve the Parish's objectives and activities, as well as providing public benefit.

Financial Review

Total income during the year was £111,632 (2023: £101,898) of which £104,366 related to unrestricted funds and £7,266 related to restricted funds. Expenditure for the year totalled £102,981 (2023: £101,838).

The Trustees have adopted a policy of holding sufficient unrestricted funds to cover three months overheads.

Going Concern

The trustees have reviewed the budgets for the year ahead and are satisfied that there are adequate funds in place to ensure that the Parish can continue its activities and the financial statements for the year end 31 December 2024 can be signed off as a going concern.

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document and Constitution of the Charity

Chapter III of the Constitution of the Church of Ireland governs Parishes and Parochial Organisation. The Select Vestry members are the Charity Trustees.

Recruitment and Appointment of Select Vestry (Trustees)

All members of the Church of Ireland who are over the age of 18 and are either resident within the Parish or live elsewhere but have been accustomed members of the congregation for at least three months, may register as members of the general vestry of the parish, allowing them to attend and vote at meetings of the general vestry and to stand for election to the Select Vestry. Meetings of the general vestry are held once a year. The Select Vestry is elected as part of this General Vestry meeting. The Select Vestry will hold their positions for a period of one year. Select Vestry members may be re-elected annually and there is no limit on the number of terms which may be served.

Organisational Structure

The Select Vestry is responsible for the day to day management of the Parish. The Select Vestry consists of the member of the clergy serving in the Parish, any curate assistant ("the curate"), the churchwardens, the glebe wardens and generally not more than twelve other members of the general vestry elected at the General Vestry.

The Select Vestry is chaired by the incumbent or other member of the clergy officiating in the Parish. Select vestry members are responsible for making decisions on matters of general concern and importance to the Parish including deciding how parish funds are to be applied.

The Select Vestry meets at times fixed by the members or by the diocesan synod. Special meetings may be convened at any time by the chairperson or the churchwardens.

Compliance with Public Benefit

The Parish has given careful consideration to the Charity Commissioner for Northern Ireland's guidance on the public benefit to ensure that the activities entered into during the year have helped to achieve the Parish's objectives and activities as well as providing public benefit.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Annual Report and the Statement of Receipts and Payments and Statement of Assets and Liabilities in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

The law applicable to charities in Northern Ireland with Income less than £250,000 requires the trustees to prepare a Statement of Receipts and Payments and a Statement of Assets and Liabilities for each financial year.

The trustees are responsible for keeping accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the Parish's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the assets and liabilities of the Parish. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Parish and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

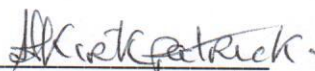

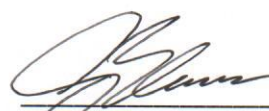

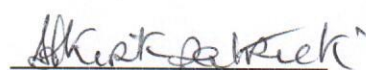

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024

1. Accounting policies

Set out below are the principal accounting policies which have been adopted in the compilation of the Receipts and Payments Account and the Statement of the Assets and Liabilities:

a) Receipts and Payments Account

All items of income and expenditure included within the Receipts and Payments Account have been accounted for on a cash receipts basis.

b) Statement of Assets and Liabilities

i) Assets retained for the Parish's own use

The assets of the Parish, retained for its own use comprise:-

- Church Building and Graveyard
- Parish Centre
- Glebe House

The Church Building and Graveyard are deemed to be Heritage assets as defined by the Charities SORP (FRS102). These Heritage assets are not included in the statement of assets and liabilities as information on the cost or valuation is not available and such information cannot be obtained at a cost commensurate with the benefit to the users of the accounts and to the Parish.

The Parish Centre was acquired on date unknown and redeveloped c.1990. There are no reliable records of the cost of this redevelopment and valuation approach for such a building lacks sufficient reliability. As a result this building is not recognised in the Parish's Statement of Assets and Liabilities.

The Glebe House is recognised at deemed cost, being the estimated fair value of the property at 31 December 2023. No depreciation has been provided on the Glebe House as the current estimated residual value is not less than its carrying value and the remaining useful life currently exceeds 50 years.

ii) Investments

Fixed asset investments comprising investments in RCB unit trusts and NFU Investment Bonds are recorded at cost.

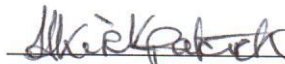

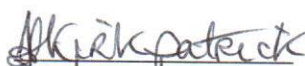

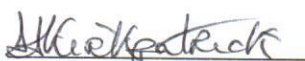

Trustees' Annual Report for the year ended 31 December 2023

The trustees present the Annual Report and Statements of Receipts and Payments and Assets and Liabilities for Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Church of Ireland for the year ended 31 December 2023.

Objectives and Activities

The charitable purpose of the Church of Ireland is the advancement of religion.

The principal function of Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Church of Ireland Parish is to support the advancement of the Christian religion by promoting, through the work of Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Church of Ireland, the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. Being open to and engaging with society as a whole and offering support for those needing help are fundamental to the practical delivery of the benefits of Christianity.

As a result of activity in the pursuit of the advancement of the Christian religion, Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Church of Ireland has custody of property and of records, materials and artefacts of significance to the cultural and religious heritage and maintenance of which is undertaken by the select vestry of Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Church of Ireland.

Achievements, Performance & Public Benefit

Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Church of Ireland has weekly services on Sunday mornings and afternoons comprising of a mix of Holy Communion, Family Services, Baptism, Morning and Evening Prayer, Compline, Late Evening Office, the Litany with various other special services during the year eg Confirmation, Lenten, Harvest Thanksgivings, Advent and Christmas. Pastoral care is provided for parishioners and those in the wider community.

A range of other activities are provided by Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Parish either by the church directly or through various church organisations eg Sunday School, the Bridge youth group, Carers and Toddlers' Group; Junior and Senior choir, Mothers' Union, Junior Badminton and a range of uniformed children's groups: Rainbows, Brownies, Girl Guides and Beaver Scouts. Other groups regularly hire the church parish centre for Bowls, Women's Institute, Wednesday Club and Veterans' Group. The parish centre is given free of charge to all children's groups and also to the Christmas Lights' Association.

A number of parishioners serve on the Board of Governors of the local primary school and the Rector leads assemblies on a regular basis. The Parish also supports the work of Scripture Union which is active in many of the local junior and secondary schools.

The activities outlined above demonstrate how Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Parish continues to implement its charitable purposes (ie the advancement of religion) and meets the Public Benefit requirement by providing the Parish Centre free of charge to local community groups, contributing to the spiritual well-being of participants and the reinforcement of Christian values.

Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Parish has mitigated any potential harm through the implementation of the Church of Ireland Safeguarding Trust Policy.

The Parish has given careful consideration to the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland's guidance on public benefit to ensure that the activities entered into during the year have helped to achieve the Parish's objectives and activities, as well as providing public benefit.

Financial Review

Total income during the year was £101,898 (2022: £76,901) of which £98,842 related to unrestricted funds and £3,056 related to restricted funds. Expenditure for the year totalled £101,838 (2022: £68,366).

The Trustees have adopted a policy of holding sufficient unrestricted funds to cover three months overheads.

Going Concern

The trustees have reviewed the budgets for the year ahead and are satisfied that there are adequate funds in place to ensure that the Parish can continue its activities and the financial statements for the year end 31 December 2023 can be signed off as a going concern.

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document and Constitution of the Charity

Chapter III of the Constitution of the Church of Ireland governs Parishes and Parochial Organisation. The Select Vestry members are the Charity Trustees.

Recruitment and Appointment of Select Vestry (Trustees)

All members of the Church of Ireland who are over the age of 18 and are either resident within the Parish or live elsewhere but have been accustomed members of the congregation for at least three months, may register as members of the general vestry of the parish, allowing them to attend and vote at meetings of the general vestry and to stand for election to the Select Vestry. Meetings of the general vestry are held once a year. The Select Vestry is elected as part of this General Vestry meeting. The Select Vestry will hold their positions for a period of one year. Select Vestry members may be re-elected annually and there is no limit on the number of terms which may be served.

Organisational Structure

The Select Vestry is responsible for the day to day management of the Parish. The Select Vestry consists of the member of the clergy serving in the Parish, any curate assistant ("the curate"), the churchwardens, the glebe wardens and generally not more than twelve other members of the general vestry elected at the General Vestry.

The Select Vestry is chaired by the incumbent or other member of the clergy officiating in the Parish. Select vestry members are responsible for making decisions on matters of general concern and importance to the Parish including deciding how parish funds are to be applied.

The Select Vestry meets at times fixed by the members or by the diocesan synod. Special meetings may be convened at any time by the chairperson or the churchwardens.

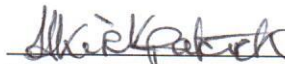

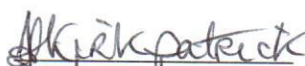

Trustees' Annual Report for the year ended 31 December 2022

The trustees present the Annual Report and Statements of Receipts and Payments and Assets and Liabilities for Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Church of Ireland for the year ended 31 December 2022.

Objectives and Activities

The charitable purpose of the Church of Ireland is the advancement of religion.

The principal function of Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Church of Ireland Parish is to support the advancement of the Christian religion by promoting, through the work of Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Church of Ireland, the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. Being open to and engaging with society as a whole and offering support for those needing help are fundamental to the practical delivery of the benefits of Christianity.

As a result of activity in the pursuit of the advancement of the Christian religion, Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Church of Ireland has custody of property and of records, materials and artefacts of significance to the cultural and religious heritage and maintenance of which is undertaken by the select vestry of Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Church of Ireland.

Achievements, Performance & Public Benefit

Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Church of Ireland has weekly services on Sunday mornings and afternoons comprising of a mix of Holy Communion, Family Services, Baptism, Morning and Evening Prayer, Compline, Late Evening Office, the Litany with various other special services during the year eg Confirmation, Lenten, Harvest Thanksgivings, Advent and Christmas. Pastoral care is provided for parishioners and those in the wider community.

A range of other activities are provided by Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Parish either by the church directly or through various church organisations eg Sunday School, the Bridge youth group, Carers and Toddlers' Group; Junior and Senior choir, Mothers' Union, Junior Badminton and a range of uniformed children's groups: Rainbows, Brownies, Girl Guides and Beaver Scouts. Other groups regularly hire the church parish centre for Bowls, Women's Institute, Wednesday Club and Veterans' Group. The parish centre is given free of charge to all children's groups and also to the Christmas Lights' Association.

A number of parishioners serve on the Board of Governors of the local primary school and the Rector leads assemblies on a regular basis. The Parish also supports the work of Scripture Union which is active in many of the local junior and secondary schools.

The activities outlined above demonstrate how Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Parish continues to implement its charitable purposes (ie the advancement of religion) and meets the Public Benefit requirement by providing the Parish Centre free of charge to local community groups, contributing to the spiritual well-being of participants and the reinforcement of Christian values.

Lisbellaw with Coolbuck Parish has mitigated any potential harm through the implementation of the Church of Ireland Safeguarding Trust Policy.

The Parish has given careful consideration to the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland's guidance on public benefit to ensure that the activities entered into during the year have helped to achieve the Parish's objectives and activities, as well as providing public benefit.

Financial Review

Total income during the year was £76,901 (2021: £85,655) of which £75,269 related to unrestricted funds and £1,632 related to restricted funds. Expenditure for the year totalled £68,366 (2021: £67,521).

The Trustees have adopted a policy of holding sufficient unrestricted funds to cover three months overheads.

Going Concern

The trustees have reviewed the budgets for the year ahead and are satisfied that there are adequate funds in place to ensure that the Parish can continue its activities and the financial statements for the year end 31 December 2022 can be signed off as a going concern.

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document and Constitution of the Charity

Chapter III of the Constitution of the Church of Ireland governs Parishes and Parochial Organisation. The Select Vestry members are the Charity Trustees.

Recruitment and Appointment of Select Vestry (Trustees)

All members of the Church of Ireland who are over the age of 18 and are either resident within the Parish or live elsewhere but have been accustomed members of the congregation for at least three months, may register as members of the general vestry of the parish, allowing them to attend and vote at meetings of the general vestry and to stand for election to the Select Vestry. Meetings of the general vestry are held once a year. The Select Vestry is elected as part of this General Vestry meeting. The Select Vestry will hold their positions for a period of one year. Select Vestry members may be re-elected annually and there is no limit on the number of terms which may be served.

Organisational Structure

The Select Vestry is responsible for the day to day management of the Parish. The Select Vestry consists of the member of the clergy serving in the Parish, any curate assistant ("the curate"), the churchwardens, the glebe wardens and generally not more than twelve other members of the general vestry elected at the General Vestry.

The Select Vestry is chaired by the incumbent or other member of the clergy officiating in the Parish. Select vestry members are responsible for making decisions on matters of general concern and importance to the Parish including deciding how parish funds are to be applied.

The Select Vestry meets at times fixed by the members or by the diocesan synod. Special meetings may be convened at any time by the chairperson or the churchwardens.
