Due to the Covid Pandemic we were unable to run our normal activities such as:

We have 32 fully functional allotments which continue to be a real success within the community. We continue to attract excellent attendance throughout the year and have in excess of 16+ volunteers helping and assisting with events. We continue to work closely with the local Housing Executive, Council, NHSC and Community Cluster.
