





Any surplus from such events is gifted to the School in pursuit of Grange Park's academic purpose.

In carrying out their duties, the trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission's public benefit requirement statutory guidance. The public benefits of Grange Park PTFA are:

Purpose 1: Improved relationships between home and school

The benefit which flows from this purpose includes funding for additional resources for the school and links built with the local community. This is demonstrated through having an active PTFA that works in partnership with the school and engages parental support.

Purpose 2: Advancing the education of pupils in the school

The benefit which flows from this purpose includes increased educational progress and attainment of pupils in the school and links built with the local community. This is demonstrated through pupils having access to resources, events, activities and links with the local community which are not available through direct school funding.

These purposes do not lead to harm. The benefits are for children at Grange Park Primary School. Charity trustees (PTFA committee members) are usually also parents at the school which their children attend and hence gain benefit in the same way as all other beneficiaries. This benefit is incidental and necessary to ensure the benefits are provided to all beneficiaries.

This year's activities

The academic year starting September marked the return of the PTA to its pre Covid format and with that came several new members. There was virtually no PTFA activity from September 21- June 2022.

Events held this year for the children, their parents and guardians restarted in September 2023 with a big focus on welcoming people back into the school grounds.

P1 parents' coffee morning ('Tea & tissues') – this free social event helps new P1 parents get to know each other over coffee and cake, introduces them to the PTFA and encourages engagement between parents and the school. Given the disruption and restrictions related to Covid and feedback from parents of children who had joined Grange in 2022 or 2021 the PTFA felt it was important to extend this to P2 and P3 parents. This led to 'Pastries with Parent's for P2 on 6th October and for P3 on 13th October.

Halloween disco (27th October) – the primary purpose of this event is to provide a fun social occasion for the pupils, while also promoting parental engagement, although it is also a successful fund-raising event. Kids (and parents) were delighted to see the return of this.

The PTFA helped serve refreshments at the P7 open evening at the start of December.

Santa came to Grange Park Primary on 21st December and the PTFA did a brilliant job of decorating his grotto.

We arranged a new event to the PTFA in March 2023- table quiz at the Bryansburn Inn. This was very well supported and expertly led by Gill McComskie and her husband Euan who did a great job as quizmaster.

Another new event was the Easter raffle and movie which was facilitated by PTFA members and teachers to provide a 'big screen' movie in the assembly hall with snacks and the chance to win an Easter hamper.

Following the success of the quiz night the PTFA were keen to host another event for parents only and this led to the return of Neill Wine doing a tasting evening for us, this time with wine. Laura Graham and team did a super job decorating the hall, preparing delicious snacks and serving the wines.

The final event of the academic year was the return of the ever-popular summer fair, in its original format, a Friday evening with everyone welcome. We saw many previous Grange Park pupils return to their old school and they especially enjoyed watching some of their previous teachers getting wet sponges thrown at them!

Spending

We opened the academic year of September 2022 with a bank balance of £ 3180.03.

The focus for the academic year 2022/ 2023 was to get a renewed sense of school community following the Covid restrictions.

The PTFA did not donate any money to the school between 1st September 2022 and 31st August 2023 but instead focused on getting the balance back up to a reasonable level with a view to making a decision on spending in September 2023.

The closing balance was £6,636.36.

This year's activities

Events held this year for the children, their parents and guardians included:

P1 parents' coffee morning – this free social event helps new P1 parents get to know each other over coffee and cake, introduces them to the PTFA and encourages engagement between parents and the school.

Breakfast at Sustrans event – the PTFA provided breakfast in support of the school's car-free day organised in conjunction with Sustrans. Encouraging walking and cycling to school helps reduce the traffic volumes around the school, improving safety and reducing pollution levels. The proceeds were donated on behalf of the school to a charitable collection for a local school child needing life-saving treatment not available in the UK.

Halloween disco – the primary purpose of this event is to provide a fun social occasion for the pupils, while also promoting parental engagement, although it is also a successful fund raising event.

Wine nights – we ran two wine tasting events, which gave parents the opportunity to socialise while also raising funds.

Ballot – donations from parents and local businesses were raffled in order to raise funds.

Big Birthday Party – to celebrate the school's 50th birthday, the PTFA in cooperation with the staff organised and funded a birthday party for the whole school. The party included many of the elements of our normal summer fair, such as bouncy castle and slide, bungee maze, sports activities, sideshows like hook-a-duck, and art and craft activities, but was held in school time and all activities were free to the children.

50th Birthday Open Night – we provided and served refreshments at the open night for past pupils and staff held to celebrate the school's 50th birthday.

Spending

PTFA funds were used on the following:

- purchase and installation of a new lighting system for the school hall, which will enhance events such as the infant nativity play, the annual P7 musical, and the school discos.
- creation of murals by a local artist around the P1 classrooms, which brighten the environment while also providing learning opportunities.
- Big Birthday Party for the school's 50th anniversary.

Surplus funds were carried over to the following year.

It also included consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as charity trustees concerning any such matters.

My role is to state whether any material matters have come to my attention giving me cause to believe:

1. That accounting records were not kept in accordance with section 63 of the Charities Act
2. That the accounts do not accord with those accounting records
3. That the accounts do not comply with the accounting requirements of the Charities Act
4. That there is further information needed for a proper understanding of the accounts to be reached.
