2nd Newtownards Rainbows is a busy unit of girls aged between 4 to 7 years old who meet on Monday evenings during school term time for one hour, from 6.30 – 7.30pm.

The Rainbow programme this year followed the 'soft launch' of the new girlguiding programmes which introduced a number of new themes and interest badges. This year the Rainbows have worked on their drawing badge and communication skill builders, using a local drama enthusiast to help their confidence in performance. They have also enjoyed making and creating and suggesting activities for their own programme, including scavenger hunts, planting flowers and themed dress up nights. The year culminated in a pot of gold party with girls receiving their newly achieved badges.
