## A summary of the Charity's main activities to further its purposes for the public benefit and the main achievements in the year

1<sup>st</sup> Moneyreagh Brownies is a group of girls aged between 7 and 10 years old who meet 30 weeks of the year on Wednesday evenings between 7pm – 8pm.
