A summary of the Charity's main activities to further its purposes for the public benefit and the main achievements in the year

There are 33 girls in the unit during the last year. Girls worked on the new Guiding Programme throughout the year, finishing with an activity weekend.

Girls in the unit completed skills builders, unit meeting activities and interest badges focusing primarily on the themes of 'Be Well', 'Have Adventures' and Skills for my Future' themes. The girls completed badges in Mindfulness, Archaeology and Languages. Brownies also took part in community activities, helping to collect items for Christmas stockings to be distributed to children in the local community.

Girls participated in a medieval themed activity weekend where the girls participated in archery, team building activities, crafts and games. The girls helped to plan the weekend as Girlguiding is a girl-led organisation.

The leaders of the unit took part in Safe Space and First Aid training, this was to ensure the safety of all members of the unit.

There was no private benefit or harm flowing from the charity's purposes.
