During the year we:

- Held an estate inspection with statutory agencies in attendance to look at areas for improvement in Glenburn. We raised issues and concerns that residents had highlighted to us.
- We held trips to Rathlin Island, The Titanic Centre Belfast and The Belfast Giants.
- We also held a Christmas Dinner and a family fun day.
- We continued with our clothing bank to help raise funds.
