



After continuing daily mosque activities by praying 5 times a day in congregation plus reading hadiths and Quran we also have a weekend children quran classes and school home works reviews.

Some time during school holidays or bank holidays the same above activities it's repeated during week days for the children.

Regularly the committee members held a meeting to discuss the community issues and transmit it to the community, also in some occasions we organised a gathering (evening barbecue) depend on the weather condition the purpose of this gathering is to make people happy and feel as a family.

During the blessing month of the Ramadan usually the community spent they most of the time in the mosque by praying, reading Quran and daily Iftar is offered in the Masjid/mosque by volunteers with high number of the people.

After Ramadan we keep celebrating Eid- Al-Fitr in the mosque following food and refreshments services.

During same period of the year, we celebrated some Akkika (new baby born celebration and names), also we celebrated and organised some Nikkahs events (new marriage) all these events took place in the Masjid/mosque.

In April a sister took Shahadat(embracing Islam) and some volunteer's sisters offer some food in order to welcome her in the community.

In last 16 of June of the current year we celebrated Eid al-Adhah, with so many guests coming from different areas of the Northern Ireland and Dublin to join us and we celebrated with all community include we invited some non-muslims to celebrate with us as a community.

Recently we received offer to improve security measure in our mosque from Home Office, something like doors and windows improvement and we welcome the offer, now they are processing the scheme following the installation.





After hiring bigger hall for mosque in April 2023, we make some change and adaptation in the new masjid hall, ex: adapted kitchen, toilet, ladies pray room and fitted with a new carpet.

After all job done, we moved to the new place and we continue to perform the 5 daily prayer in congregation at masjid/mosque and also, we have children's classes on weekends and bank holidays. On evening time some children come for they school home work.

We provided meals to the community during the 30-day month of Ramadan during the breaking of the fast. We then had Eid gatherings twice gathering over 150 people.

With the expansion in the lady's section ladies manage to have ladies only gatherings where they discuss amongst themselves and get to know about each other and how to uplift the community.

The masjid also hosted different Muslims from other communities who came to pay a visit from Malaysia, Belfast and Craigavon.

We held different events like marriage and small religious parties in the new property that helped to bring and gather the community together.

We also getting in touch with local Council in order to provide us Islamic cemetery plot yards.

Finally on Friday 29th December 2023, along with 73 community members we held an AGM (annual general meeting), after Jummah/Friday prayer where we discussed several topics and how to improve our involvement to the voluntary community's work.
