

Main Activities to further the Charity's purposes for the public benefit

The main activities of the Charity are the organisation and facilitating of trips and events for the residents of the area of benefit in order to provide enjoyment, education and to help build relationships with neighbouring communities.

Over this past year we received funding from Radius in July which enabled us to organise a cross community bus trip to the Jet Centre and Portrush for parents and kids with a meal in McDonalds on the way home. They also funded the replacement of the bulbs and plants in Bonds Street playpark. We were also allocated funding from Good Relations and we were able to take parents and kids from cross community to Rosepark Farm, which everyone thoroughly enjoyed.

We are still working with the Rathmore Centre on a cross community basis and enjoy making different arts and crafts, day trips, history talks and creative writing classes with the ladies in Creggan.

During the year we have also gone on shared outings and gardening classes with Lincoln Courts Community Association.
