Purpose and Objectives of Holy Trinity Foundation:

Objectives, Activities and Performance:

In setting our objectives and planning our activities for the year the trustees have given careful consideration to the Charity Commission NI's guidance on public benefit to ensure that the activities have helped to achieve the charity's purpose and provide a benefit to beneficiaries.

During the year the following fundraising events were held to help meet Holy Trinity Foundation objectives:

Much of our fundraising efforts have been focused on the development of facilities that will ultimately benefit the wider community of Cookstown, particularly the young people of the town and surrounding areas. We encourage our young people to get involved in our fundraising efforts which helps instil a sense of belonging, a sense of accomplishment, it helps them to develop new skills and to understand the importance of supporting good causes. Young

people and current Holy Trinity College pupils have been involved in the fundraising efforts of the foundation through helping organise, manage and take part in the Annual Pupil Sponsored Walk, the Annual Golf Classic and Frozen – the school show and the Community Concert – ‘Songs of Inspiration’. Members of the school community both past and present took part in fundraising events, in particular the Community Concert – ‘Songs of Inspiration’ and the Golf Classic.

The grant received in the reporting period from PHA Mental Health Support Fund Clear Project enabled us to meet one of our key priorities of providing a support programme and event for parents/caregivers of children with autism both in our wider community and the surrounding catchment. An event was held, ‘Lets Navigate Autism Together’ which enabled those present to make connections, get advice and information and establish new support networks. This was followed up with a 6 week Autism Support Project.

The work of Holy Trinity Foundation is ongoing, both in the planning of fundraising events and on grant applications, so as to continue to meet our purpose and objectives as detailed in our Constitution.
