Principal activity

We carry out a wide range of activities, projects and services focusing on improving the well being, mental and physical health of the wider community, tackling issues relating to deprivation, the legacy of the conflict and improving good relations. Creggan is an area with a deep history of the conflict and Creggan Community Collective has been at the fore in terms of looking to promote a positive image of the local area. This has included working with young people on an intergenerational basis who have been affected by the conflict on all sides. Our members are involved in welfare rights and housing advocacy and environmental issues including a community garden and allotments.
