

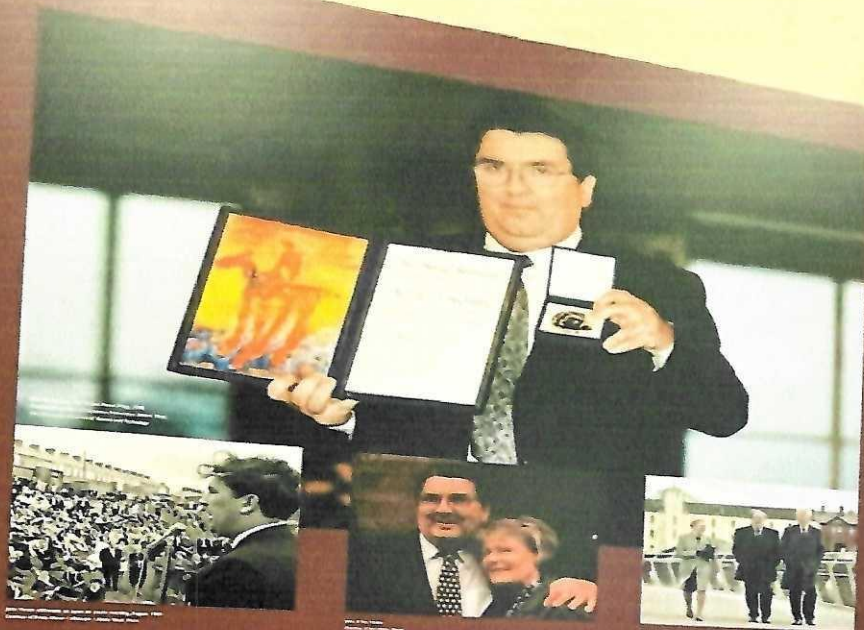

JOHN HUME

LEADER, VISIONARY, PEACEMAKER

John Hume was born in 1937 into a background of injustice and division in Derry City. He graduated from the National University of Ireland at Maynooth and taught French and History at St Columba's College, Derry.

John was a change-maker long before he was a politician. In founding the Derry Credit Union and the Derry Housing Association, he pioneered the transformation of the city. He established a culture of empowerment through his leadership of the Northern Ireland Civil Rights Association which challenged discrimination in housing, inequality and gerrymandering of electoral boundaries.

He passionately believed that change could be made by collective peaceful pressure, by politics of engagement, by building partnerships, by mutual respect, dialogue and reconciliation. He pushed new ways of reconciliation.

He was a founding member of the Social Democratic and Labour Party (SDLP) in 1970 and was elected to the parliament of Northern Ireland. He was also elected to the European Parliament. John Hume is credited with being the chief architect of the Good Friday Agreement of 1998. In recognition of his contribution he was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize, the Gandhi Peace Prize and the Martin Luther King Jr. Peace Prize. He was also awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.

John Hume died on 2 August 2020.

Chairperson's address

The John and Pat Hume Derry Trust was incorporated on 24th October 2022 as a charity.

This report covers the period 24th October 2022 to 31st December 2023.

The Purposes of the Charity

The John and Pat Hume Derry Trust has been established for the education of persons in the field of peace, the understanding of peaceful activities and the achievement of conflict resolution through dialogue and mutual understanding. In particular it aims to ensure that the Peace Prizes awarded to John Hume and other relevant archival materials can play a role in education for peace - building resolution.

What the charity has done during the period under review to carry out its purposes - its activities

The ownership of the Peace Prizes, archival materials and other artefacts have been transferred to this Trust from the Estate of Pat Hume

This is to ensure that they will be held in trust for the benefit of the public

and cannot be used for the individual benefit of the Trustees.

The Nobel, Martin Luther King and the Mahatma Gandhi prizes were loaned to the Derry City and Strabane Council.

The Prizes continue to be on loan to the Derry City and Strabane District Council, where they are on public display.

A formal written agreement is in place.

Archival materials and other artefacts are also on loan to the Derry City and Strabane Council under a similar agreement.

The archival materials and other artefacts are in secure storage with the Museum Service until a suitable location is found that will permit public access.

Details of how the activities of the charity has provided a benefit to the beneficiaries and how this has been demonstrated - the achievements of the charity.

The Nobel, Martin Luther King and the Mahatma Gandhi Peace Prizes have been on permanent exhibition in the Guildhall, Derry, since 10th December 2022.

They are freely available for viewing by the general public, in the interests of education for peace and conflict resolution.

It is envisaged that following cataloguing and curation activities, other materials will be made available to the public via appropriate access methods.

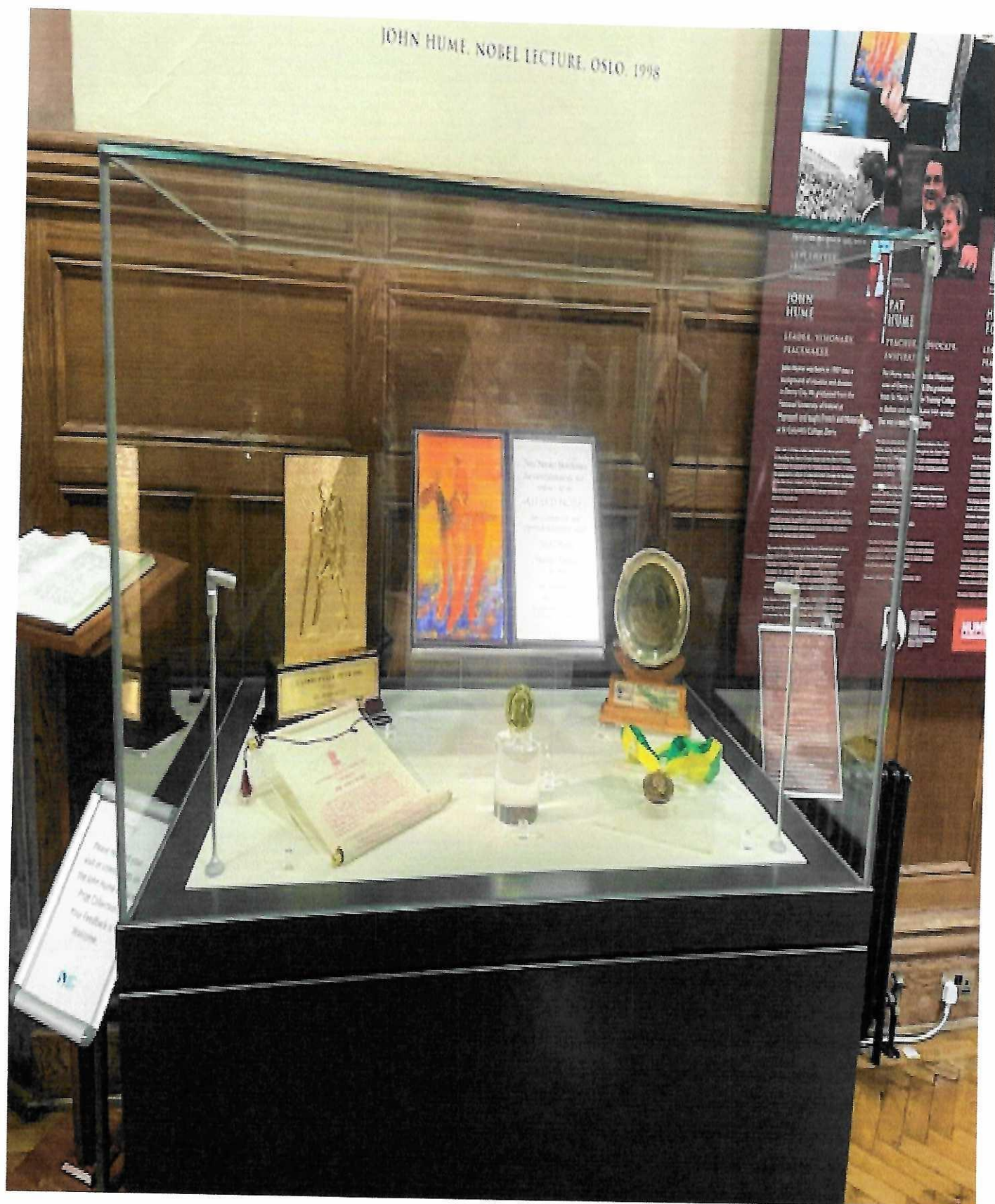
