Structure, Governance and Management

The Church was administered in accordance with the terms of the Church of Scotland Model Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form).

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Sole nominee, Rev Karlien Becker was accepted by the congregations of North Carrick and Kirkmichael linked with Straiton after preaching over two Sundays in three places of worship. Rev Karlien Becker was inducted by Presbytery to the charge on 9 September 2025. Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the Elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The Minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the Congregation and inducted or ordained by Presbytery.

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session met eight times during the year.

The Kirk Session is responsible for both spiritual and temporal affairs within the Church.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Services of Worship: Services of Worship are held every Sunday in Crosshill, Maybole and Kirkoswald throughout the year. During the summer months a Breakfast Church service is held in Maidens hall at 9 am for holiday makers and locals, conducted by Rev Connie Bonner. Breakfast rolls are offered and made to order at Little K Café next door. There were two services of Communion held during the year in each place of worship and all were made welcome. An Easter Sunday service conducted by Rev Connie Bonner was held on the shore in Maidens followed by breakfast of bread and fish in the hall. A joint service was held in the Carrick Centre on 15 June to hear the Sole Nominee preach. Watch night services on Christmas eve were held in all three churches. On the first Sunday of the new year a joint service was held in Crosshill followed by a cooked breakfast enjoyed by all.

Youth Activities The Young Adventurers, in Maidens folded in February.

The Guild: The Guild meet in Crosshill twice a month during the winter. A busy syllabus has kept the members entertained and informed. The annual daffodil tea raises funds and welcomes visitors to the social evening. The Guild with support from Rev Connie Bonner held the World Day of Prayer in Kirkoswald followed by a cup of tea in the hall.

Achievements and Performance:

The church has continued to maintain a positive commitment during the past year.

We are indebted to Linda Stroud and Fisherton Worship Team for conducting worship at Kirkoswald regularly during the continuing vacancy and to Lynne Rankin and the Worship Group for their services at Maybole and Crosshill. This with pulpit supply has ensured services every Sunday in each church. With the appointment of Rev Karlien Becker in September, services are taken by her and Rev Duncan Campbell on the alternate Sundays, holidays are being covered by Linda and Lynne.

Maybole church is incorporated within the Carrick Centre, allowing the local community to work in partnership to promote a shared sense of growth for the inhabitants of Maybole. A well established choir lead the congregation each Sunday and often contribute to Church worship with an anthem. Monthly Sunday afternoon services have recommenced at Malin Court, Maidens from January 2026.

We have continued to develop our Fairtrade status and are registered members of the Scottish Fairtrade Forum. The local Foodbank is supported by monthly donations from the church.

Rev Connie Bonner took the Maidens Summer Breakfast Church Services again this year, always a treat for holiday makers who want an early start. Hot rolls were bought in the Little K's café next door, cereal, fruit juice, tea and coffee served to those who wanted it.

The property team lead by property convenor Jim Whiteford continues to keep the buildings and grounds in good repair. Thanks are due to all the volunteers who give of their time and talents to maintain a high standard with little or no cost to the church. Kirkoswald manse continues to be let and the minister resides in the Maybole manse.

Lisa Caldwell collected shoe boxes from the congregation and friends supporting The Samaritans Purse.

Tea is available every Sunday after the Maybole service.

On the first Sunday of the month at Kirkoswald a cup of tea is served in the hall after the service.

A glossy A4 quarterly North Carrick magazine distributed to every household in the villages shares what is going on in the Church. Magazines are posted to members not living in the parish.

A team of volunteers from Recovery Ayr have come on four occasions to work in the garden at Kirk Wood, Kirkoswald. We thank them for their continued support. The Criminal Justice team regularly cut the grass at Maidens and Kirkoswald.

The halls in Kirkoswald and Maidens continue to be let and generate income for the church.

Financial Review

The Church's principal source of income is by donation.

Total receipts for the year were £97,461. This is the first full year of the new union.

Excess unrestricted payments over receipts for the year is £15,315, this is after fabric expenditure of £12,294.

Pulpit supply of £5,481 and vacancy expenses of £4,607 were met by a transfer of £10,088 from the Ferguson Bequest.

Expenses for 2026 are expected to be greater than 2025 as with the appointment of a minister there is now council tax, telephone and travelling expenses to be paid.

A new energy tariff has been agreed by Church of Scotland and our existing energy supplier for a further two years. The kWh unit charge is 10% less and the standing charge remains the same. Crosshill electricity has now been transferred to the Church of Scotland scheme.

Church of Scotland Insurance Services has been transferred to insurance brokers Howden Insurance Ltd. Our first point of contact remains with Church of Scotland, Edinburgh and they liaise with the broker.

The other running costs have remained tight in 2025 due to continued support by members volunteering with cleaning, gardening, painting, pressure washing paths and opening halls for hall lets.

Once again volunteers assembled to take on the Charity Shop week. Abundant donations of goods to sell were collected and generated £1773, (2024 £1306). This has been allocated to the 250th Anniversary fund. The now annual Christmas Fayre at Kirkoswald raised £960, (2024 £627).

Crosshill Community Lunches continues to generate income for the Church but more importantly a warm space for people to come together in friendship to enjoy a cooked meal. After costs £936 was raised. These events only happen when everyone pulls together to help with the event or comes along to support it.

The Church income is enhanced by interest and income earned from investments relating to a legacy received from Mrs Urie, Turnberry in 2013.

Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of approximately six months expenditure including designated funds. At the year end the Church held unrestricted liquid funds of £68,790. The Trustees are satisfied that the level of reserves held is adequate to allow the charity to operate successfully.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year.

The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Independent Examiner's Report
to the Trustees of Kirkoswald Parish Church of Scotland**

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2025 which are set out on pages 6 to 10.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

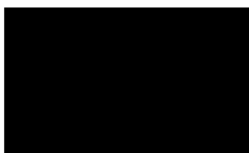

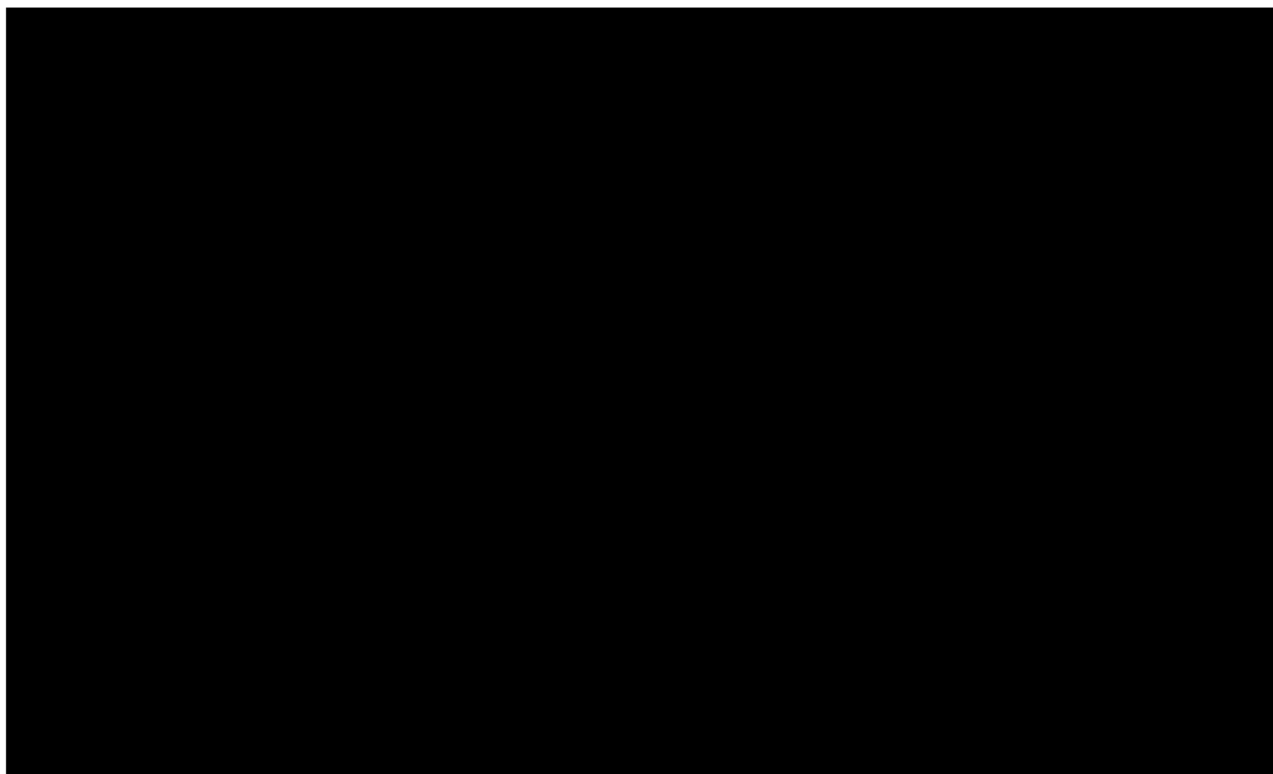

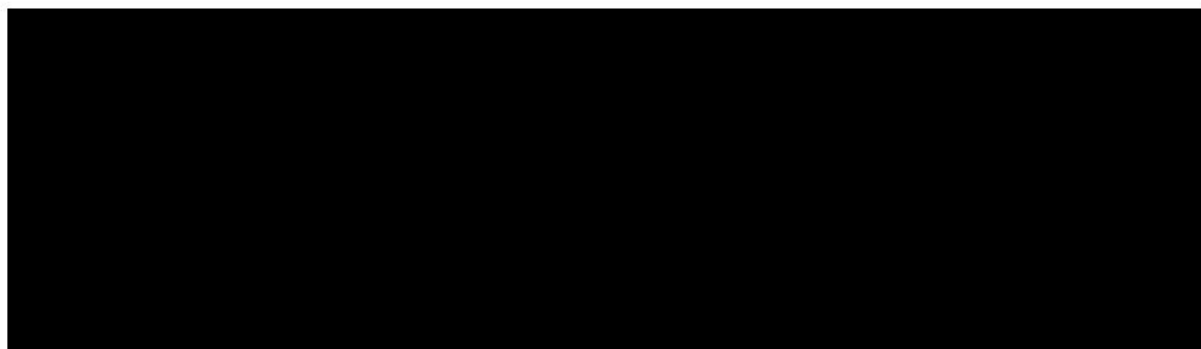

A team of volunteers from Recovery Ayr have come on four occasions to work in the garden at Kirk Wood, Kirkoswald. We thank them for their continued support. The Criminal Justice team regularly cut the grass at Maidens and Kirkoswald.

The halls in Kirkoswald and Maidens continue to be let and generate income for the church.

Financial Review

The Church's principal source of income is by donation which increased with the Union in June 2024. Gift Aid for 2024 has still to be claimed.

Total receipts for the year were £114,999, this includes Kirkoswald manse rental of £5,400 and bank and deposit balances brought in with the Union of Maybole and Crosshill of £44,182.

Excess unrestricted receipts over payments for the year is £17,541, this is after fabric expenditure of £11,647.

Giving to Grow payments have greatly increased since the Union. This is because Maybole linked with Crosshill had one minister allocated and Kirkoswald had a minister, after the union this is now only one minister for all. As both were vacant a vacancy allowance reduced the amount payable to Edinburgh by £22,003. In 2025 Edinburgh have decided to remove the vacancy allowance and we can reclaim pulpit supply instead. The Giving to Grow amount for 2025 will be £63,169 (for 2024 adding the annual cost of the three charges £43,766).

The electricity fixed rate tariff ended September 2023. The new tariff up by 98%. There were difficulties with the change over and no invoices were raised for the Church and Kirkoswald Hall by the new provider thus 3 months electricity for 2023 was paid in 2024. The costs at Kirkoswald are £6330 (2023 £2216). The heating costs at Crosshill for seven months is £3084 (2023 £nil prior to Union). The other running costs have remained tight in 2024 due to continued support by members volunteering with cleaning, gardening, painting, pressure washing paths and opening halls for hall lets.

Once again volunteers assembled to take on the Charity Shop week. Abundant donations of goods to sell were collected and generated £1306. The now annual Christmas Fayre at Kirkoswald raised £627. Crosshill Community Lunches continues to generated income for the Church but more importantly a warm space for people to come together in friendship to enjoy a cooked meal. These events only happen when everyone pulls together to help with the event or comes along to support it.

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Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year.

The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

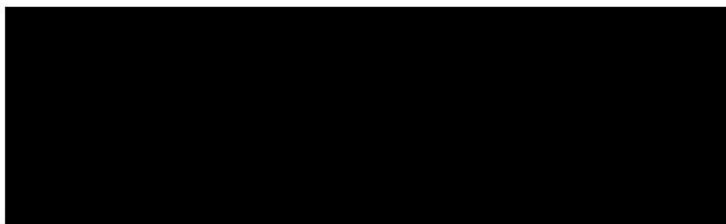

Guild Fund: The Trustees have set aside funds for the operation of Guild activities.
Lunch Club: The Trustees have set aside funds for a monthly community lunch club
Youth Work to be used to finance future youth activities.
Choir to be used to purchase music related items as required.
