Various successful fundraising events allow for the continued functions of the hall and community larder.

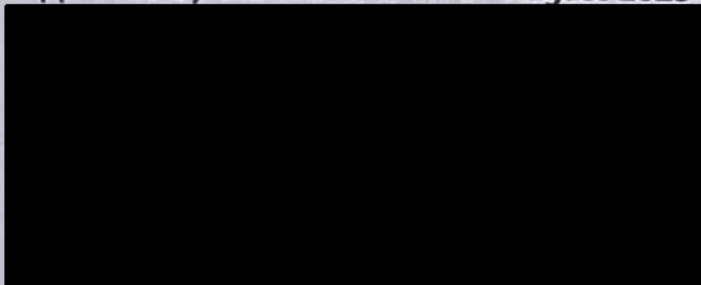

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT

For the year from 4 April 2024 – 3 April 2025

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Culrain & District Hall Committee, registered charity number SC000517.

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 3 April 2025, set out on pages 6- 8.

Respective responsibilities of trustee and examiner

The charity's Trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and trustee Investment (Scotland) 2005 Act and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. 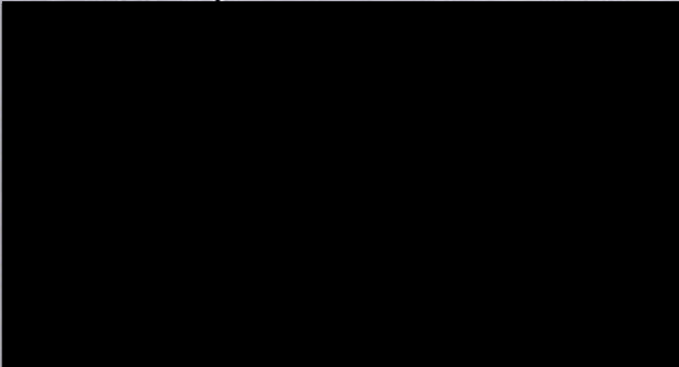
