Trustee recruitment and appointment

Trustees shall be elected triennially beginning April 1982 at an annual general meeting. The number of trustees shall be nine with one trustee being the owner of Giblestone House. Trustees shall hold the office for three years and be eligible for re-election for a further three years.

Other than the owner of Giblestone House the trustees will be voted on by the inhabitants both male and female of the village of Scalloway and its environs aged 18 or over.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

The building is held in trust for the purpose of a public hall for the use of the inhabitants of the village of Scalloway and its environs without distinction of political, religious or other opinions, including use for meetings, lectures and classes, and for other forms of recreation and leisure time occupation, with the object of improving the condition of life for the said inhabitants.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

The hall is used for:

- Parent and toddler group
- Community Council meetings
- Room hire for private meetings, other charitable organisations, public consultations, voting etc
- Fundraising activity for the hall committee and other local charitable organisations
- Social and entertainment events
- Local weddings, funerals, celebrations
- Evening Classes
- Karate Club (new group)

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Scalloway Public Hall has slowly been getting back to normal following Covid and has been busy with activities and events over the year, including weddings, parties, and other events.

Some local groups have restarted to use the hall, including the Scalloway parent & toddler group, The Shetland Dogs Club, The Karate Club, etc.

Unfortunately, Scalloway Fire Festival was cancelled again due to Covid and this resulted in loss of income through ticket sales and bar takings.

The outside area at the main entrance of the hall has been completely refurbished with the old handrails and tarmac being removed. the area has been re-slabbed and is now much more accessible and attractive.

The internal hallway and toilets have been repainted which has been carried out by the community pay back group.

Looking ahead the committee will continue to fundraise and refurbish the inside of the hall where possible. Running the hall is an ongoing challenge for the local community relying on good will from volunteers who give their time to benefit others.
