Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form).

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session are the Charity Trustees. The Kirk Session Members are the Elders of the Church and are chosen from those Members of the Church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The Minister, who is a Member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the Congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session is chaired by the Minister and meets five times a year. It is responsible for spiritual and temporal affairs within the Church. Certain responsibilities are delegated to the Finance Committee and the Property Committee as appropriate.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every Parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It cooperates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Achievements and Performance

Forty to fifty people attend worship on a Sunday morning in Gatehouse Church, rising to sixty in the summer, with regular visitors and holiday makers, and even more for services at Christmas, Easter, Harvest and Remembrance. On the first Sunday of every month a service is held in Borgue Village Hall. Once a month in Gatehouse we are joined by a Sunday School of about six children who come into the Church for the first part of the service and then go through into the Hall. There is a choir of around twelve singers, performing an introit at the beginning of each service, and occasionally an anthem as well. The hall is also a regular meeting place for a group of senior citizens, the Monday Club and Churches Together.

Volunteers

The church relies on the contribution of volunteers to carry out its activities but no amounts are recorded in the accounts for this.

Financial Review

Unrestricted donation income (including Gift Aid income) has decreased by some £31,716 in the year.

Other staffing costs have increased by around £3,000 due to increase of organ player payments. Repairs total has decreased by some £2,000 and Manse building costs has increased by around £1,600 due to Fencing repairs in March 2025.

The main result of the year's transactions is that there is an unrestricted deficit of £22,549 for the year. The restricted surplus was £383 and endowment surplus £145.

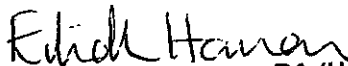
Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement

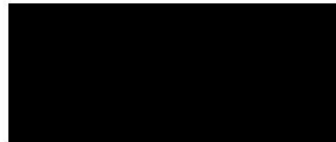

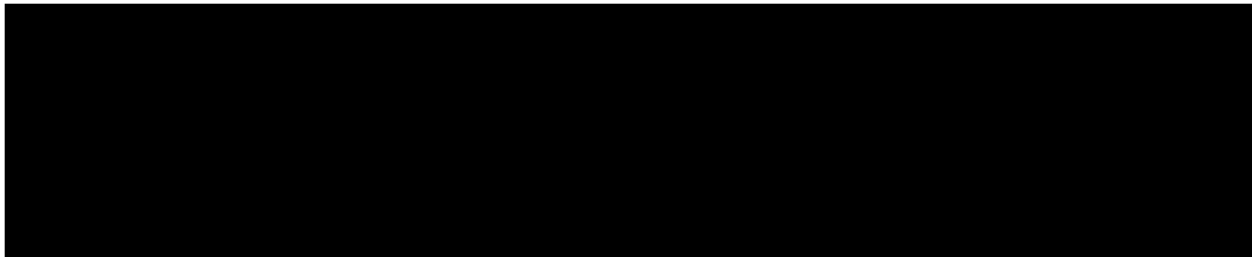

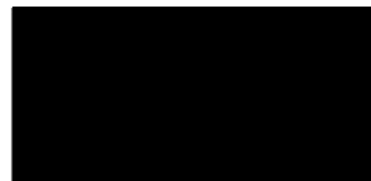

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form).

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session are the Charity Trustees. The Kirk Session Members are the Elders of the Church and are chosen from those Members of the Church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The Minister, who is a Member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the Congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session is chaired by the Minister and meets five times a year. It is responsible for spiritual and temporal affairs within the Church. Certain responsibilities are delegated to the Finance Committee and the Property Committee as appropriate.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every Parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It cooperates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Achievements and Performance

Thirty to forty people attend worship on a Sunday morning in Gatehouse Church, rising to over fifty in the summer, with regular visitors and holiday makers, and even more for services at Christmas, Easter, Harvest and Remembrance. On the first Sunday of every month a service is held in Borgue Village Hall. Once a month in Gatehouse we are joined by a Sunday School of about fourteen children who come into the Church for the first part of the service and then go through into the Hall. There is a choir of around nine singers, performing an introit at the beginning of each service, and occasionally an anthem as well.

Volunteers

The church relies on the contribution of volunteers to carry out its activities but no amounts are recorded in the accounts for this.

Financial Review

Unrestricted donation income (including Gift Aid income) has increased by some £1,800.

Other staffing costs have increased by around £2,700 due to increase of organ player payments. Repairs total has increased by some £500. Manse building costs has decreased due to boiler repairs in the 2022.

The main result of the year's transactions is that there is an unrestricted surplus of £6,370 for the year. The restricted surplus was £224 and endowment surplus £128.

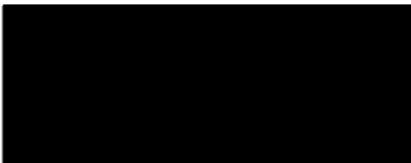
