A. Governance, Structure and Management

1 Governing Document

Kingcase Parish Church is administered in accordance with the Unitary Constitution of the Church of Scotland, and within the overall framework of the laws, rules, and regulations of the national Church.

2 Trustees

The members (Elders) of the Kirk Session are the Charity Trustees. The Minister is "called" and elected by the Congregation and ordained/inducted by the Presbytery of the South West. The Kirk Session is made up of the Minister and Elders who are chosen from those Church members who are considered to have the appropriate abilities and skills for the temporal and spiritual oversight of our Church. Eldership is "for life."

3 Organisational Structure

Meetings of the Kirk Session are chaired by the Minister as moderator.

Following the adoption of the Unitary Constitution, a new structure taking the form of purpose Teams was introduced to take account of the Kirk Session taking responsibility for the temporal as well as the spiritual affairs of the Church. These Teams are responsible directly to the Kirk Session for the remits each covers.

The Kirk Session has four main meetings each year, with additional meetings being called as required. It is likely, that in future, the number of meetings will increase given the potential additional business falling on the Kirk Session as a consequence of the adoption of the Unitary Constitution. Meetings of the Kirk Session are well attended, and business is conducted efficiently.

B. Objectives and Activities

1 Objectives

As part of the Church of Scotland, Kingcase Parish Church exists to glorify God, and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom in our Parish and throughout the world.

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in its tradition, and Presbyterian in its organisation. As a national church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the essential points of the Christian religion to the people in every Parish in Scotland through a territorial ministry – "a Church in every Parish." It co-operates with other churches and ecumenical bodies locally, in Scotland and beyond.

2 Activities

In addition to Church services, our halls and facilities are well used, offering a comprehensive choice of varied social activities. Most of the activities offered are open to the local community, catering for all age groups.

Gratitude is recorded to the Fellowship and Hospitality team for their involvement and organisation of social events throughout the year. They have included: Beetle Drive, Congregational VE Day lunch, Summer Fete, Harvest Lunch, and Musical Christmas Fayre.

C. Achievements and Performance

1 Attendance

Attendances at Sunday Worship number regularly between 60 to 80 members. The Sacrament of Holy Communion was offered on six occasions throughout the year with an average attendance between 90 to 100 members.

The Circle of Care Service held on 7 September and the Annual Remembering Service, on 14 December, offered all who attended the opportunity of quiet reflection, thanksgiving, and fellowship.

The Joint Children's Summer Holiday Club with St Nicholas Church held in Kingcase from 11-14 August, has contributed to the encouraging increase in the number of Children and families joining with the congregation to celebrate our All-age family services.

Sincere thanks are extended to both the Pastoral Care team and Children and Families team for their ongoing commitment to the work within these areas.

Prestwick Kingcase St. Nicholas Guild dedication service took place on Sunday 14 September 2025, at Kingcase. The Guild meet each week throughout their programmed year which commenced October 2025. Meetings alternate between Kingcase on a Wednesday and St. Nicholas on a Thursday afternoon. There is a healthy membership and very good weekly attendances. The Guilds will not join financially until the deferred union takes place and until then each will send Capitation Fees and financial returns separately operating under separate charity numbers. In all other aspects they are operating jointly. The joint Leadership Team are delighted with the way the group is progressing.

The fortnightly online Ministry of Music services offered via Zoom came to end in January 2025. The services created in the Autumn of 2020 during Covid, enabled an opportunity to be inspired with hymns, prayer and friendship. Grateful thanks are expressed to the 4 former team members.

Youth organisations meet weekly in our church halls; numbers registered during 2025 are:

- 4th Prestwick Rainbows:-
18 girls (aged 4-7), with 3 Fully Trained Leaders, 3 Unit Helpers, 3 Young Leaders and 1 Guide.

All Young Leaders and Adults have attained their "Safe Space" training. Congratulations are extended to the two young leaders who have recently turned 18 years of age and are beginning their adult leader training.

2 Roll

Our church membership as of 31 December 2025 has decreased from 352 to 337. The decrease sadly was due to the deaths of 13 members throughout the year and 2 members requesting Certificate of Transfers.

3 General

Revd. Ian Wiseman, our Minister, leads Sunday Worship. His preaching is well received and his pastoral work assiduous and much appreciated. During 2025, there was one baptism, and eleven funerals conducted.

The Minister and Elders carry out a considerable number of visits within the Parish. Church members receive a visit prior to each of the four main Communion Services. In addition, each member receives a copy of the Church's magazine "Grapevine."

Sincere thanks are recorded to our Pastoral Care team, for the ongoing support offered by them to include additional visits where possible to members in local hospitals and nursing homes. Grateful appreciation is expressed to Revd Sandra Black, for her ongoing support and service within the Pastoral care team. Offering Home Communion to aged or infirm members who are unable to attend Church worship.

CD recordings of weekly Sunday services are created and distributed. There is a weekly volunteer transport rota which operates to bring members, mainly elderly or disabled to Church as required.

Our duty teams have continued throughout 2025 to offer a warm welcome to all members and visitors attending Sunday worship.

Over the year, the Church's mission has been enhanced by the efforts of members who organise, carry through or help provide a rich programme of religious, social, and fund-raising activities and events, not only for members but also for our community, and for all ages.

Overall, Kingcase Church is in good heart, spiritually and socially, and is financially self-sufficient. We have much to rejoice about.

4 The Future

As members of Kingcase we look forward in faith to support our Minister, serve our members and our community, and to advance Christ's Kingdom here in Prestwick.

5 Financial Review

Church Income dropped from £137,611 in 2024 to £110,910 in 2025. However it must be remembered that we did receive a substantial legacy of £25,398 in 2024 and we have withdrawn £31,000 from the Cuthbertson Bequest in 2025. If we remove these exceptional items from each year then it shows that income in 2025 dropped to £79,910 compared to £112,213, a reduction of £32,303 or 28.8%. The mainstay of our income is Gift Aid donations, the FWO and the Open Plate. The income from these 3 items decreased from £52,471 to £48,870 a drop of £3,601 or 6.9%. On the positive there were good incomes from lets of our premises of £11,300 and from the Efforts Fund of £5,824.

On the expenditure side our contributions to Giving to Grow have reduced from £50,344 in 2024 to £47,257 in 2025. Heating and lighting costs continue to rise. Up from £6,450 to £7,611 in 2025. With regard to our property we replaced the overhead projector in the church and attached an electric charger to the manse. Money was withdrawn from the Cuthbertson Bequest to fund these items.


The above resulted in a surplus of £4,551 compared to the deficit of £24,288 in 2024.

The Trustees of the Cuthbertson Bequest reported that the capital value of the investment at 31st December 2025 was £88,907. This compares to £113,157 as at 31st December 2024. The Bequest generated an income of £3,139 in 2025 compared to £3,437 in the previous year.

6 Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees policy to hold sufficient reserves to meet current expenditure including designated funds. At the end of the year the Church held unrestricted funds of £11,865 of which £1612 is the Guild, £2,497 is the General Account and the Efforts Fund is £7,756.



Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Kingcase Parish Church

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31st December 2025 which are set out on pages 9 to 13.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1)(d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1)(c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

5 Ministers Stipend

All Church of Scotland congregations contribute to the National Stipend Fund which bears the costs of all ministers' stipends and employer's contributions for national insurance, pension and housing loan fund.

Ministers' stipends are paid in accordance with the National Stipend scale, which is related to years of service. For the year under review the minimum stipend was £32,433 and the maximum stipend in the fifth and subsequent years of service £39,856

In addition to stipend the church pays the Council Tax for the manse, ministers travelling expenses and the manse telephone account.

In 2025 the cost of these 3 items was £5,327.58.

Although entitled to do so, our minister does not claim car mileage or any other miscellaneous expenses such as worship aids, postage and stationery.

A. Governance, Structure and Management

1 Governing Document

Kingcase Parish Church is administered in accordance with the Unitary Constitution of the Church of Scotland, and within the overall framework of the laws, rules, and regulations of the national Church.

2 Trustees

The members (Elders) of the Kirk Session are the Charity Trustees. The Minister is “called” and elected by the Congregation and ordained/inducted by the Presbytery of Ayr. The Kirk Session is made up of the Minister and Elders who are chosen from those Church members aged at least 21 years and who are considered to have the appropriate abilities and skills for the temporal and spiritual oversight of our Church. Eldership is “for life.”

3 Organisational Structure

Meetings of the Kirk Session are chaired generally by the Minister as moderator. Following the adoption of the Unitary Constitution, a new structure taking the form of purpose Teams was introduced to take account of the Kirk Session taking responsibility for the temporal as well as the spiritual affairs of the Church. These Teams are responsible directly to the Kirk Session for the remits each covers.

The Kirk Session has four main meetings each year, with additional meetings being called as required. It is likely, that in future, the number of meetings will increase given the potential additional business falling on the Kirk Session as a consequence of the adoption of the Unitary Constitution. Meetings of the Kirk Session are well attended, and business is conducted efficiently.

B. Objectives and Activities

1 Objectives

As part of the Church of Scotland, Kingcase Parish Church exists to glorify God, and to work for the advancement of Christ’s Kingdom in our Parish and throughout the world.

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in its tradition, and Presbyterian in its organisation. As a national church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the essential points of the Christian religion to the people in every Parish in Scotland through a territorial ministry – “a Church in every Parish.” It co-operates with other churches and ecumenical bodies locally, in Scotland and beyond.

Our Church, halls and facilities are well used, offering a comprehensive programme of social activities, many of which are geared towards fund-raising for our own church developments, and for charitable causes both local and international.

Events this year have included: Coffee Mornings, Easter Services, Harvest Lunch, Beetle Drive, Sale of Quizzes, and the celebration of 90 years of Kingcase in Flowers.

C. Achievements and Performance

1 Attendance

Attendances at Sunday Worship number regularly 70+ members. The Sacrament of Holy Communion was offered on six occasions throughout the year with average attendances around one hundred members.

The Circle of Care Service held in September and the Remembering Service, held in December, were both well attended, offering all, the opportunity of quiet reflection, thanksgiving, and fellowship.

There has been an encouraging increase in the number of Children and families joining with the congregation to celebrate the All-age family services. Our thanks are extended to the Children and Families team for their continued work in this area.

The Mens club meet fortnightly in the Ford Hall, with an average attendance of twelve. The fortnightly online mid-week Ministry of Music services continue to be offered via Zoom invitation. It has proved popular, with a regular average attendance of fifteen.

This year, Kingcase Guild and St Nicholas Guild united and are now known as Prestwick Kingcase St. Nicholas Guild. Their dedication service was held on Sunday 8 September 2024, at St. Nicholas Church. Regular weekly meetings have taken place at both church premises, Kingcase on a Wednesday afternoon, and alternate Thursday afternoons at St. Nicholas, with an average attendance of thirty-one.

Youth organisations meet weekly in our church halls, numbers registered during 2024 are:

4th Prestwick Rainbows - 18 girls (aged 4-7), three young leaders (aged 14-18), three qualified leaders over 18 years of age, and three Unit Helpers over 18 years of age.

4th Prestwick Brownies - 22 girls (aged 7-10), three young leaders (aged 14-18), four qualified leaders over 18 years of age, and three Unit helpers over 18 years of age.

All Young Leaders and Adults have attained their Safe Space to enable a Unit meeting.

12th Ayrshire (Kingcase) Scout Group - 17 Beavers (aged 5-7), 6 Cubs (aged 8-9), 8 Scouts (aged 10-12), 12 Explorers (aged 13-17), plus two young leaders (who are also Explorers) aged 16 and 17, and ten adult leaders.

Boys Brigade - 2024, has seen the first full operating year, following the merger of 2nd/4th Prestwick (Kingcase) Boys Brigade Company, and 1st Prestwick Boys Brigade Company. To avoid any duplication of reporting numbers within Church of Scotland annual returns, the membership figure for 1st Prestwick Boys Brigade has been recorded within Monkton and Prestwick North Church 2024 statistical return.

2 Roll

Our church membership as of 31 December 2024 stood at 352.

3 General

Revd. Ian Wiseman, our Minister, leads Sunday Worship. His preaching is well-received and his pastoral work assiduous and much appreciated. He has achieved much since his induction as our Minister, in December 2015. He is involved in the Presbytery of the Southwest of Scotland meetings and committees. He also takes part in assemblies for the local schools of which he is chaplain.

During 2024, there was one baptism, and twenty funerals.

The Minister and Elders conduct a considerable number of pastoral visits within the Parish, and to members in local hospitals and nursing homes. Each Church member receives a visit prior to each of the four main Communion Services. In addition, each member receives a copy of the Church's quarterly magazine "Grapevine." Home Communion is offered to aged or infirm members who are unable to attend Church. CD recordings of weekly Sunday services are created and distributed. There is a weekly volunteer transport rota which operates to bring members, mainly elderly or disabled to Church as required.

Our duty teams have continued throughout 2024 to offer a warm welcome to all members and visitors attending Sunday worship.

Over the year, the Church's mission has been enhanced by the efforts of many members who organise, carry through or help provide a rich programme of religious, social, and fund-raising activities and events, not only for members but also for our community, and for all ages.

Overall, Kingcase Church is in good heart, spiritually and socially, and is financially self-sufficient. We have much to rejoice about.

4 The Future

As members of Kingcase we look forward in faith to support our Minister, serve our members and our community, and to advance Christ's Kingdom here in Prestwick.

With the agreed Basis of Deferred Union having been approved earlier this year, work has continued with the completion of a Joint churches profile document. Additionally, both churches have attested electoral registers in place.

The next step on this journey will be the congregational meeting on Sunday 12th January 2025, whereby a nominating committee shall be elected. A total of Thirteen (13) members, seven (7) from Kingcase, and six (6) from St. Nicholas will form this committee.

5 Financial Review

In 2024 church income increased to £137,611 compared to £107,806 in 2023. However, Kingcase did receive a legacy of £25,398 from Dr F. B. Wilson during the year and we did withdraw £20,000 from the Cuthbertson Bequest. This distorts the comparison with 2023. If the legacies and the withdrawal were removed our church income would be £92,213 compared with £96,108 last year. This is a decrease of £3,895 or 4.01% below 2023.. However, the mainstay of our income is the Gift Aid Donations, the FWO and the Open Plate. The income from these three items decreased slightly from £56,382 in 2023 to £52,471 in 2024. This is a decrease of £3,911 or 6.9%. This decrease was more than offset by the receipt of the legacy mentioned already. There were also good incomes from the Efforts Fund of £6,419 and contributions for the use of our premises of £9,515.

On the expenditure side our contributions to Giving to Grow have remained steady at £50,344 In 2024 we paid £50,344 compared to £50,758 in 2023. The heating and lighting costs this year are £6,450 compared to £1,475 last year. You may remember we received a substantial refund on our gas heating bills last year. With regard to our property we started the year by decorating the church. During the year we had to renew the manse roof to prevent further damage caused by falling roof tiles. The cost of the new roof was £19,980 and £20,000 was withdrawn from the Cuthbertson Bequest to fund this. Also the manse conservatory roof was renewed with the addition of a thick layer of insulation.

The above resulted in a deficit of £24,288 for 2024 compared to the surplus in 2023 which was £11,278.

The Trustees of the Cuthbertson Bequest reported that the capital value of the investment at 31st December 2024 was £113,157. This compares to £107,112 as at 31st December 2023. The Bequest generated an income of £3,437 in the year to 31st December 2024.

6 Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees' policy to hold sufficient reserves to meet current expenditure including designated funds. At the end of the year the Church held unrestricted funds of £13,010 of which £1,856 is the Guild and £18 for the Sunday Funday Club. The remaining balance of £11,136 is in the General fund and the Efforts fund and this is regarded as adequate to meet current requirements.

5 Ministers Stipend

All Church of Scotland congregations contribute to the National Stipend Fund which bears the costs of all ministers' stipends and employer's contributions for national insurance, pension and housing loan fund.

Ministers' stipends are paid in accordance with the National Stipend scale, which is related to years of service. For the year under review the minimum stipend was £31,642 and the maximum stipend in the fifth and subsequent years of service £38,884

In addition to stipend the church pays the Council Tax for the manse, ministers travelling expenses and the manse telephone account.

In 2024 the cost of these 3 items was £4,842.62.

Although entitled to do so, our minister does not claim car mileage or any other miscellaneous expenses such as worship aids, postage and stationery.
