Other services are held for Bible Study and Prayer to further this aim. Weekly activities are held for children of a range of ages for Christian instruction and to encourage love and respect for all people.

Service to the local community takes the form of groups such as Busy Bees Parents & Toddlers, Youth Stars for older children and the making available of our facilities to others.

Planned activities take place to bring Biblical truth to those in the local area in a constructive manner.

Financial support is given to a wide variety of organisations and individuals who provide spiritual and social activities across the world.

## APPENDIX 1

## Achievements and performance

### Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

During the year the charity paid out grants totalling £10,344 to assist six charities and individuals working to assist those in need, provide education and spiritual guidance or to help develop their local community. Around £5,000 of this was used to support charitable and missionary work overseas – mostly in Third World countries. Funding and finances remain quite tight this year which saw a net deficit of £4,278 following church and manse property maintenance of around £11,000.

## Financial review

### Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

There are no Restricted Funds.

The Unrestricted Funds represent receipts received but not yet utilised in supporting charitable activities. At 31 December 2024 the charity held £57,278 at the bank and the Trustees consider this to be appropriate to allow them to respond promptly to requests for financial support and to provide for the ongoing commitments to maintain the Church building and Manse and to meet the normal running costs of the church and the minister's salary.

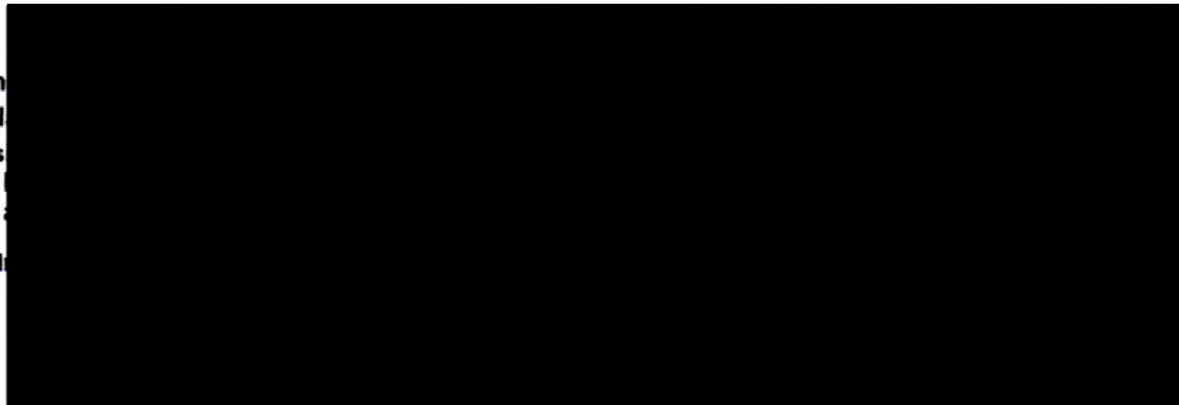
