Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

The objects of the Organisation shall be:-

- (a) to promote the benefit of the inhabitants of the Glenrothes area and in particular the local precincts or neighbourhood.
- (i) Giving guidance to organisations and community groups
- (ii) Associating the voluntary organisations, local authorities and the community in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare and to act as an advisory body in the provision of such facilities;
- (iii) Making and encouraging provision to help educate young people through their leisure time activities to develop their spiritual, mental and physical capacities to enable them to grow to full maturity as responsible individuals and members of society and that their conditions of life may be improved;
- (iv) Fostering a community spirit for the achievement of these and such other purposes as may by law be deemed to be charitable.
- (b) To establish or to secure the establishment of a Community Centre (hereinafter referred to as "the Centre") and to maintain and manage, or to co-operate with any local statutory authority or authorities in the maintenance and management of such a Centre for activities promoted by the Organisation and its constituent bodies in the furtherance of the above objects or any of them.
- (c) The Organisation shall be non-discriminatory in politics and religion.
- (d) The Organisation and its constituent bodies shall have power to affiliate to National Associations and other organisations whose objects shall not be inconsistent with these set out above.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

The Centre provides a location for the use of various activities covering the aspects of but not limited to education; returning to work; meetings for councils or similar; pre-school children; youth clubs; ladies club; seasonal fundraising events for children, community Christmas Lunch, Discos and the main Gala; fitness and sporting classes for children to senior citizens; specialist bookings for the disabled or those requiring some or full-time care.

The hall is in addition to the regular hires able to be booked out for ad-hoc evenings and at the weekend which is popular for birthday parties.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

The Centre was able to continue to increase the footfall of Café, despite the prices having to be raised slightly to accommodate inflation and the effects of the price increases on all raw materials, food and beverages, including the significant jumps on costs for the heating and lighting. The classes held in the centre throughout the year have been steady with a few more interested groups.

The Tuesday Lunch Club continues to grow in strength with a diverse set menu and celebrations for special days (Mother's Day; Easter; Valentines Day to name a few) with an average 25 to 30 attendees each week from all sectors of the community.

The 'Café Inc.' arranged by Fife Council is popular during the school holidays (a provision of a packed lunch for all school children). In addition, 'Warm Spaces' was also very well attended, providing a warm meal; hot & cold beverages; activities for all ages during the colder months and word quickly spread throughout the community.

The staff, management and volunteers continue to address new ideas suggested by members of the community who attend the classes; events and the Café.

The Centre community is looking forward to celebrating its 50th Anniversary, plans are currently being discussed on the best kind of event(s) to celebrate this significant milestone and accommodate the community spirit to its fullest capacity.

The fundraising events held during the course of the year were well attended by the community members and hosted by staff, volunteers and management committee. Donations were very gratefully received as well as Grants that were applied for and received.

The Centre's Memorial Garden continues to be maintained by groups of volunteers who are encouraged to help within the community.

The Sunshine Club - for disabled persons & their carer(s), running on a Monday and Friday continue to be popular and allows the service users to relax in an environment without the fear of isolation.

The Youth Club's attendees are significantly increasing on both days requiring more supervising adults by ratio.

A new fridge and chest freezer had to be purchased as the old ones were no longer serviceable or able to fulfil their tasks.

An AGM is planned for early next year when new Trustees will be appointed and the previous Trustees officially retired. We have been aware of the need of an AGM but due to circumstances out with our control including the slow recovery after COVID an AGM has not been possible until now, we had tried previously but had insufficient attendees to reach the required quorum as per the constitution.

Financial review

The Bank Balances are to pay for the future activities and the day to day running of the Centre; help raise funds for the repair and maintenance of the building and grounds. The balances that remain in the bank accounts include some restricted funds for a particular area / event or Grant and are detailed in the 'Other Grants' Section.

The Bank Balances include part of the Recurring Grant from Fife Council not yet claimed – these are claimed during the month after the transaction took place.

C1 Nature and purpose of funds (may be stated on analysis of funds worksheets)

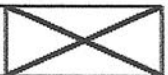
All monies held by the centre at the end of any given period are unless stated for a specific purpose are for the continuation of payments to allow the centre to run its day-to-day business without impeding on the centre users, staff or volunteers. Limiting Funds(Unrestricted Funds) from Fife Council in the form of Recurring Grant 'Fife Council Grant Aided' is to enable the charity to function on a day-to-day basis. Other Grants are allocated to a specific fundraising event and all the funds are used with little or none left over. Any surplus or 'profit' received from the fundraising events is transferred to the 'Building and Fundraisings Account', which is helping to cover the costs of routine maintenance and/or costs incurred for renovations, the Other Grants include (but not limited to) - the Memorial Fund; Gala; Christmas Meal and Party; Kitchen; Office; Other Children's Based Events and Specific funds 'New Table Fund'. All fundraising events held within or on behalf of the centre are for the community, the Grants that are applied for and awarded reflect this.

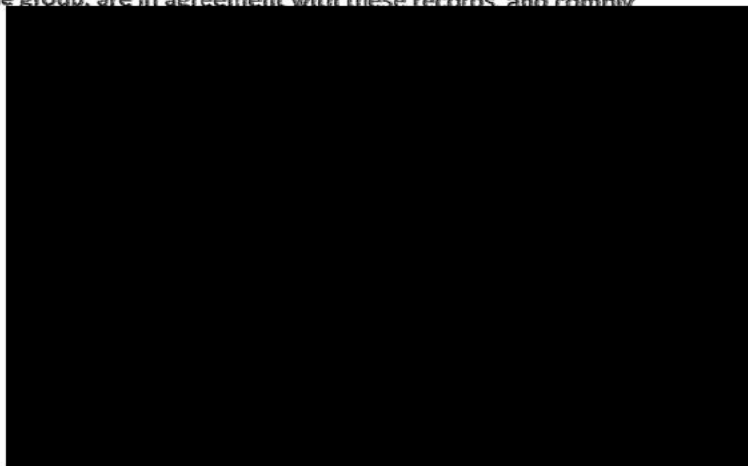
