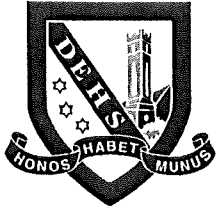

Financial Review

The charity had a surplus for the year of £10,599 (2024: £2,043).

Reserves Policy

It is the trustee's policy to hold reserves of approximately three months normal expenses being approximately £20000, so that in the event of a significant drop in income the charity can maintain its current level of activities for a reasonable period until replacement funding is obtained. At the year end the charity held unrestricted cash funds of £72,230 (2024: £61,631) which represents more than three months expenditure.

Trustees Responsibilities in relation to the Financial Statements

Charity law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year. In preparing these financial statements, the Trustees are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and

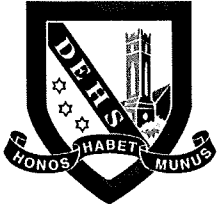



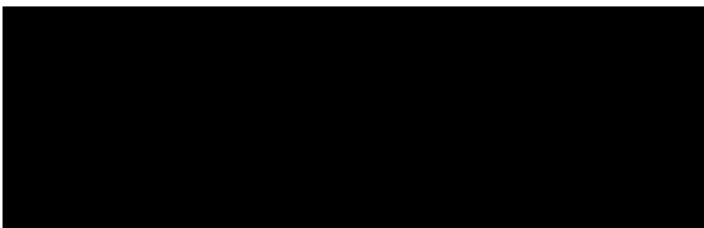
