Session Report

Session has met in April, June, August, September, November, January and March. We continue with no-one as Session Clerk but with the duties spread among the team- Mrs Ann Munro looking after Communion arrangements, Mr Denham Kirkpatrick keeping the minutes of our meetings and Dr Ivy Barclay seeing to pulpit supply and other duties.

Help with Pulpit Supply has been given by Miss Barbara Graham. On two Sundays the worship was led by members of the congregation at short notice due to home circumstances of Dr Ivy Barclay. Piano/ organ playing has been provided by Mr Denham Kirkpatrick, Mrs Margaret Wright, Mr David Kerr and Mr Eric Oliphant. Our thanks to them all.

As the church was closed on the second Sunday of June due to the 'Roon the Toon' road race, those who wished were invited to 'Coffee and Praise' at Wilson Ave, Troon. This will be repeated this year. On 15th June the congregation enjoyed a fellowship meal in the large hall after the morning service.

We were glad to welcome the Fellowship of Kilmarnock Churches to Winton Place on 22nd June. The service was led by Barbara Graham and worship enhanced by a group of singers from Aspire, Centrestage as well as the Salvation Army band.

As usual gifts were given at Harvest Thanks giving, which were passed to the Community Fund of the Kilmarnock branch of the Salvation Army. The collection was sent to TearFund for the Afghanistan earthquake Appeal. Donations were also given to Erskine Hospital on Remembrance Sunday and EACHA on Christmas Eve.

This year's Christmas Shoe Box appeal for Blythwood Care was well supported by Rainbows, Brownies and Guides as well as the congregation. 107 boxes and £103 were given.

The Trailblazers group for children between 4 and 11 started with Messy Church on Saturday 23rd August. This was supported by Congregational Federation President Mrs Caroline Stott and her book 'Belinda Bee'. The group met each month. The Kilmarnock Churches Christmas Trail for school age children around the town centre churches was again well attended.

Working with Disclosure Scotland all church Trustees now have a PVG certificate.

The Congregational Federation produced a Bible course called 'All for Jesus, Jesus for all' Bible Study. Rev Ivy Barclay took part in a pilot scheme by zoom over the summer. We used this as our theme for the Lent Bible Study.

Winton Place was to be host for the Congregational Federation Scottish Area Assembly in June 2026 but due to a change of date to 13th June we withdrew and the Assembly will now be held at Knightswood Congregational Church.

Session's thanks are expressed to all who help with church work in a variety of ways throughout the year.

Congregational Federation in Scotland

Congregational Churches are independent and each responsible for their own affairs, but we are also inter-dependent and members of the Congregational Federation.

The Congregational Federation in Scotland meets as an Area Council in September, November and February. We are usually represented by Ivy Barclay. The Area also holds an Assembly in June and a Conference in October. These are hosted by different churches each year. Last year the assembly was in Dundee and the Conference, at Coatdyke, Airdrie. We attended both meetings by zoom.

Managers/Trustees Report 2025/26

Rev Dr Barclay has continued as Acting President chairing the Managers meetings. The managers met in the normal cycle through to February 2026 but then changed to only meeting every two months with our last meeting having been in April.

The managers would like to place on record the sincere thanks of the congregation to Jean Duncan for her years of service as treasurer. Jean has finally been able to fully pass on the baton after a few years of trying. She'll be a hard act to follow. We also need to thank Rev Dr Ivy Barclay who has kept this in good order when Jean was unfit to do so.

Several running repairs were carried out over the year to the church buildings, most notably to the roof and to the drain and downpipe at the back door. We had a small problem with a rat family in the basement and we are still to have a third visit from East Ayrshire Council to ensure we are clear to cover the holes in the vents, steps and stonework.

Some upgrades were made to the sound system with the purchase of new microphones and the replacement of some cables. Thanks again go to Jim Logan and his helpers for keeping the grass cut and the grounds tidy and to Senga McGeary for keeping the premises clean.

We held our congregational meal in June last year and we will continue with this again this year. The Candle Tea was held as usual in December and was enjoyed by those in attendance. Mrs M Farquharson took up the post of Tea Convenor, appointed by the managers. We continued our long standing partnerships with both Loudon Musical Society and Beechwood Nursery, both use the hall facilities for their activities.

All trustees of the church are now fully PVG compliant, able to work with both vulnerable adults and children. These certificates will last for five years.

The grateful thanks of the managers and the congregation go to Rev Dr Ivy Barclay for her sterling work on behalf of the church, both as the spiritual leader and in all the other roles she fulfils. A servant of the LORD in many ways. Thanks also go to the managers who put in lots of work often unnoticed, keeping the church functioning and looking good in many important ways.

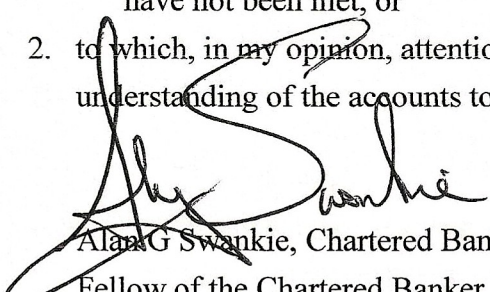
Basis of independent examiner's statement

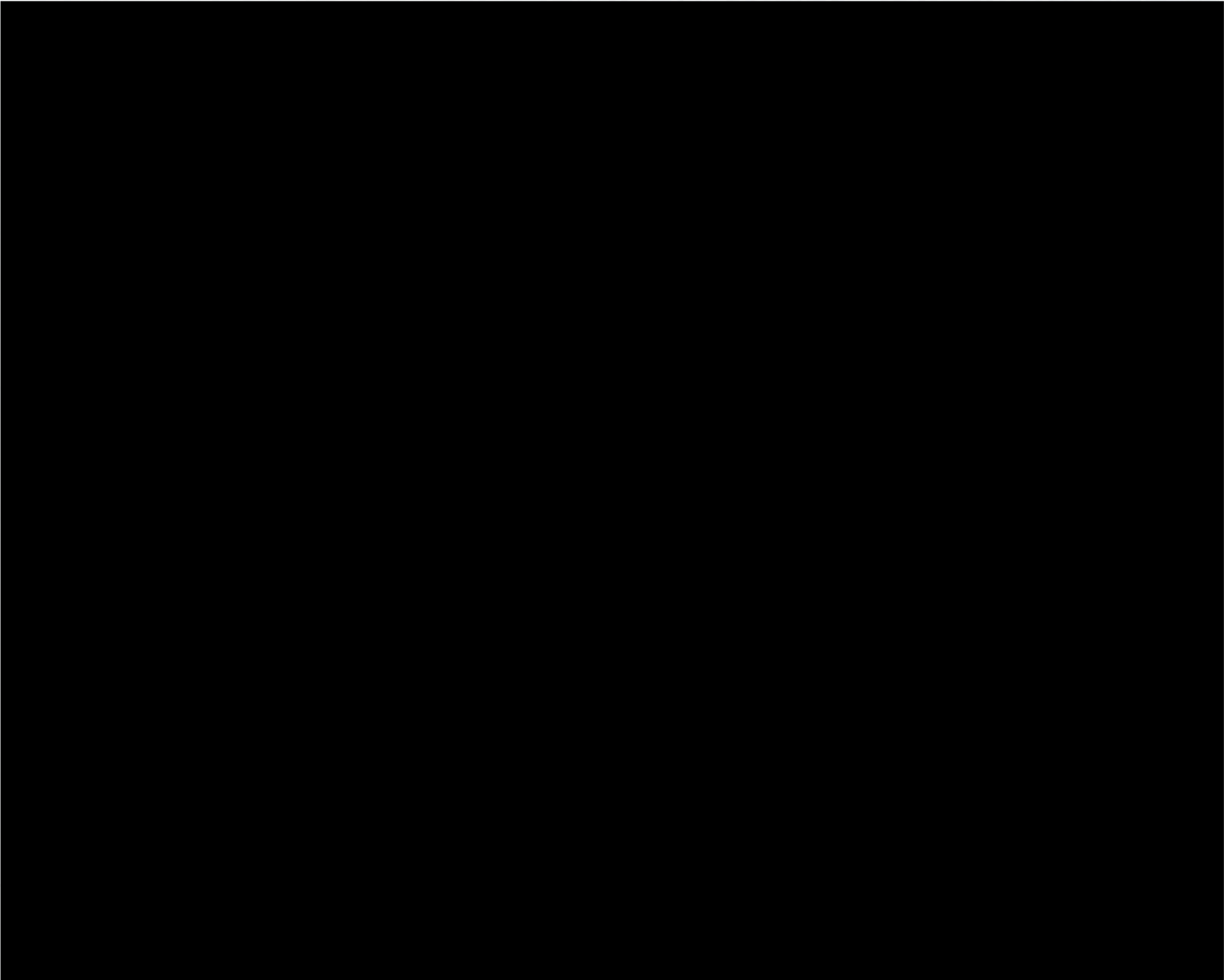

As usual gifts were given at Harvest Thanksgiving, which were passed to the Community Fund of the Kilmarnock branch of the Salvation Army. Donations were also given on Remembrance Sunday and Christmas Eve.

This year's Christmas Shoe Box appeal for Blythwood Care was well supported by Rainbows and Brownies as well as the congregation. 95 boxes and £250 were given.

The Trailblazers group for children between 4 and 11 met on a monthly basis. Between 2 and 8 children attended. The Kilmarnock Churches Christmas and Easter Trails for school age children around the town centre churches were well attended.

[REDACTED] Coatdyke Congregational Church, led worship in October ahead of our anniversary close this as a separate service, due to a clash of dates.

Disclosure Scotland has now been appointed to ensure that all church Trustees have a PVG certificate. We are in the process of all being legally recorded.

This year's Lent bible study has been on the theme 'Staying close' to God.

Lastly, the Deacons' Fund has not been used for over 20 years. This £715 is ringfenced in our accounts. It is proposed that at the AGM we close this as a separate account.

Last year the assembly was at West End, Kirkcaldy and the Conference, at Motherwell. We attended both meetings by zoom.

The Congregational Federation in Scotland Support Group had hoped to hold a Roadshow to encourage sharing between churches. Despite the preparation of some online material, this has been put on hold, as the Scottish Area Chairman resigned. He has been called to a new charge at Market Harborough. Our new Chairman, [REDACTED] will take up office at the Scottish Assembly in June.

Managers/Trustees Report 2025

In the absence of a permanent president [REDACTED] has continued as Acting President and has chaired the monthly meetings of the managers [REDACTED] has also continued as Treasurer but has intimated her desire to resign and have someone new take on the role. I'm sure everyone knows that this is a vitally important administrative function of church life and it really needs someone who is capable to come forward and take this over. Please consider this prayerfully.

During the past year the church vestibule was painted and the outside windows of the hall were painted and sealed. The insides of the hall windows were also washed, a job that was overdue. The railings and the outside doors were also painted. Both halls and the managers room were tidied during a summer clean-up and vegetation on the outside was also cut back. Several repairs were made to the roof but we did get off fairly lightly with storm damage. The next scheduled job is the pointing at the hall door. Again we had several issues with the church heating which hopefully now have been corrected. The carbon monoxide monitors in the church were also replaced. Thanks again go to [REDACTED] who keep the grass and the grounds in good order during the year, as well as many other unseen things.

We held a congregational meal in June 2024 and this will be repeated this year. The Candle Tea was again a huge success in December.

We took a step forward by acquiring extended Mission Praise books which gives us some new scope in worship and praise.

We also went Eco conscious by taking recycling bins from East Ayrshire, rather than just having a general waste bin. We now have a paper bin and a plastics bin.

Under a new law which came into force on April 1st, all trustees of a charity are required to have a PVG certificate, this work is ongoing but hopefully will be completed in the not too distant future.

Again thanks are due to [REDACTED] for her sterling work, doing whatever she needs to do, wherever she needs to be. Thanks are also due to all the managers for attending to administration and fabric matters to keep the church functioning in the right manner.
