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## **BARVAS CHURCH OF SCOTLAND**

### **Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 December 2024**

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2024. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

##### **Objectives and aims**

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Morning and evening worship is held every Lord's Day, as well as a weekly meeting for bible study and prayer every Wednesday evening. The Sunday School and Bible Class meets every Sunday during morning worship.

Our aims are to seek to spread the Gospel further into the community by providing resources that place the Church as one of the major venues in the community where not only members and adherents, but also friends and strangers can come and gather at the various services and functions and feel it a worthwhile experience. We also hope to provide a safe place for children to gather in an environment that is both pleasant, welcoming and educational and which provides spiritual and moral guidance. We want to see the people of God grow in faith using the gifts that God has given to us in practical ways. Our hall will provide us with opportunities to share and to serve, to befriend and belong, so that we can carry out a range of ministries to the congregation and wider community.

#### **ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE**

##### **Charitable activities**

Five years since the Covid Pandemic began, and now since its demise, many aspects of congregational life are rapidly returning and improving. Mid-week prayer meeting is well attended both via Zoom and personal attendance. Sunday services are well attended, and especially morning service. The Sunday School and Bible Class has fully recovered to above numbers seen before Covid. Sunday school address is taken by Locum or visiting preacher. The elderly and sick are visited regularly within the community and at the local hospital. Spring and summer fundays, barbecues and gatherings are envisaged for the children. The congregation continue to support the Church of Scotland both spiritually and financially as well as making donations to a considerable number of Missionary Organisations both Nationally and Internationally.

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

##### **Reserves policy**

It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of approximately six months' expenditure.

At the end of the year the Church held total cash funds of £64,545 of which £49,925 related to the Unrestricted General Fund.

##### **Financial review**

The principal source of income is the Weekly Freewill Offering Gift Aid scheme which this year has increased by £1,764 (5.73% more than the 2023 figure). WFO (non Gift Aid) donations decreased this year by £1,837 (6.3% less than the 2023 figure). Gross income received has decreased by £2,316 (3.1 %) in the year.

During the year the charity received £8,618 from HMRC for Gift Aid of which £ 1,326 related to donations to the Restricted Fabric Fund.

#### **STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT**

##### **Governing document**

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the former United Free Deed of Constitution.

##### **Recruitment and appointment of new trustees**

Members of the Kirk Session and Deacons Court are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members and Deacons Court are the elders and deacons of the church and are chosen from those male members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### Organisational structure

The Kirk Session and Deacons Court is chaired by the minister and meets frequently throughout the year and is responsible for the management of all matters within the church.

#### Church buildings

The church building, hall and manse are held by the General Trustees of the Church of Scotland and are managed and maintained by the Kirk Session. The charity has the right to occupy and use these buildings for the furtherance of its stated charitable objectives, with no consideration payable in relation to this.

**STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES**

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Report of the Trustees and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

The law applicable to charities in Scotland, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and the provisions of the charity's constitution, requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charity for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charity SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and the provisions of the charity's constitution. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2024 set out on pages five to eleven.

**Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner**

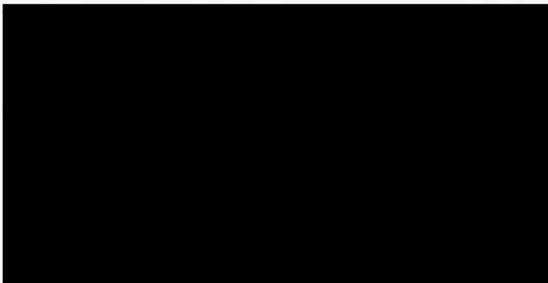
**Independent examiner's statement**

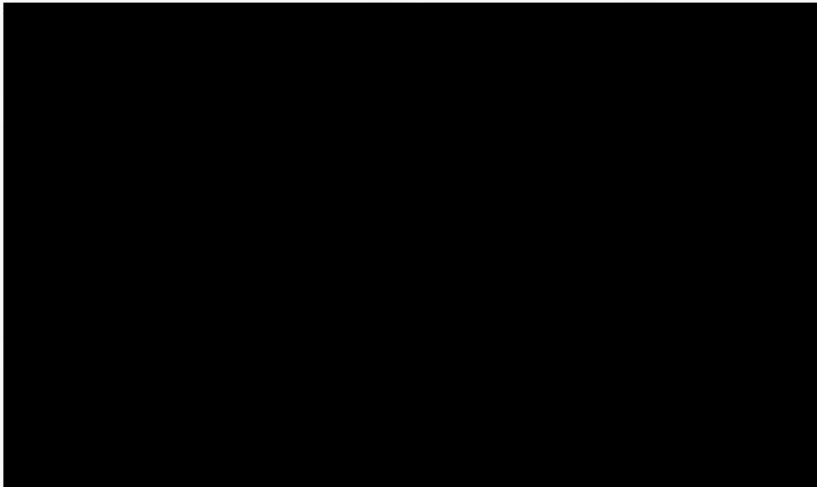

### Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2024

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

##### **Basis of preparing the financial statements**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

The accounts are prepared on a Receipts and Payments basis.

##### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

##### **Fund accounting**

Funds are classified as either restricted funds or unrestricted funds, defined as follows:

- Unrestricted funds are expendable at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity.
- If parts of the unrestricted funds are earmarked at the discretion of the trustees for a particular purpose, they are designated as a separate fund. This designation has an administrative purpose only and does not legally restrict the trustees' discretion to apply the fund.
- Restricted funds are funds subject to specific requirements as to their use which may be declared by the donor or with their authority or created through legal processes, but still within the wider objects of the charity.

#### 2. TRUSTEES' REMUNERATION AND BENEFITS

During the year [REDACTED] received remuneration of £350 in his capacity as Relief Church Officer.

During the year [REDACTED] and his wife received gifts and presentations totalling £1,600, on the occasion of Rev Wolf's retirement.

##### **Trustees' expenses**

There were no trustees' expenses paid for the year ended 31 December 2024 nor for the year ended 31 December 2023.

#### 3. MINISTER'S STIPEND

All Church of Scotland congregations contribute to the National Stipend Fund which bears the costs of all ministers' stipends and employer's contributions for national insurance, pension and housing and loan fund. Ministers' stipends are paid in accordance with the national stipend scale, which is related to years of service. For the year under review the minimum stipend was £31,642 (2023 - £30,135) and the maximum stipend (in the 5th and subsequent years) £38,884 (2023 - £37,032).
